## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT STATE AND COUNTY DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES MEET CERTAIN GUIDELINES BEFORE PASSING ANY ORDINANCE OR RULE THAT RESTRICTS SUBSISTENCE FISHING.

WHEREAS, subsistence fishing is a way of life in the State; 1 2 and 3 WHEREAS, many recent proposed rules and actions taken with 4 the intent to protect and preserve ocean resources have had 5 unintended consequences on those who practice subsistence 6 fishing; and 7 8 WHEREAS, many who practice subsistence fishing feel that 9 certain guidelines must first be met to prevent blind rulemaking 10 that can unreasonably restrict the practice of subsistence 11 12 fishing; and 13 WHEREAS, for example, the lack of clear definitions and 14 unspecified goals of limiting "unsustainable" practices or 15 protecting "sustainable resources" can be vague and may place 16 blame on subsistence fishing when certain issues may not, in 17 fact, result from subsistence fishing; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, although data is often cited, it is unclear how the data is collected, upon which proposed rules and actions 21 that restrict subsistence fishing are based; and 22 23 WHEREAS, there are other options available to mitigate 24 threats to aquatic resources, and restricting the practice of 25 26 subsistence fishing should be a last resort; and 27 WHEREAS, if a department or agency determines certain 28 fishing restrictions, like bag limits, are necessary, these 29 restrictions should be temporary and a plan to increase the 30 specified biomass of an aquatic resource should be partnered 31 with the mitigation of threats to the sustainable production of 32 that aquatic resource, such as implementing artificial reefs; 33 34 and 35



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WHEREAS, state and county departments and agencies that 1 propose rules and take actions that restrict subsistence fishing 2 should clearly state the expected outcome for the proposed rule 3 to be adopted and the action to be taken; and 4 5 WHEREAS, before imposing limits, state and county 6 departments and agencies should also consider and identify all 7 8 population factors equally, including but not limited to residents and times of high or low tourism, and not place blame 9 primarily on those who practice subsistence fishing for 10 unsustainable levels of take; and 11 12 WHEREAS, to assist with tailored solutions that work 13 towards sustainable production and to address real issues, state 14 and county departments and agencies should meet certain 15 guidelines before passing any law, ordinance, or rule that 16 restricts subsistence fishing; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 20 that state and county departments and agencies are requested to 21 meet certain guidelines before passing any ordinance or rule 22 that restricts subsistence fishing; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that state and county departments 25 and agencies are requested to provide to the public the 26 27 following information before passing any ordinance or rule relating to subsistence fishing: 28 29 30 (1)The method of collecting data upon which the law, ordinance, or rule is based, including whether the 31 data was collected under abnormal conditions, such as 32 33 during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic, severe weather events, or decreased traffic due to natural 34 disasters; 35 36 (2) Disclosure of accurate numbers; 37 38 39 (3) The steps and methods taken, and any definitions used, to determine whether a species is sustainable or 40 unsustainable; and 41 42



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1 (4) The plan to increase specified biomass along with any 2 restrictions or mitigation efforts and the time limits of the restrictions; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that state and county departments 5 and agencies are requested to generate a report that contains 6 clear methods and guidelines for rulemaking that restricts 7 subsistence fishing and to post the report in an easily 8 accessible format and location on the department's or agency's 9 website to be made available for public viewing; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 12 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the 13 14 Board of Land and Natural Resources, and the Chairs of the 15 Honolulu City Council, Maui County Council, Hawaii County Council, and Kauai County Council. 16 17
