SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROMPTLY REINSTATE FUNDING FOR THE UNITED NATIONS RELIEF AND WORKS AGENCY FOR PALESTINE REFUGEES IN THE NEAR EAST TO SUPPORT ITS LIFE-SAVING AND CRITICAL HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS TO PALESTINIAN REFUGEES.

1 WHEREAS, the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for 2 Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) has been providing 3 critical humanitarian aid to Palestinian refugees since its 4 establishment in 1949; and 5 WHEREAS, innocent men, women, and children in Palestine 6 7 continue to face dire humanitarian conditions, including mass 8 displacement, loss of livelihoods, and limited access to necessities such as food, clean water, and health care services; 9 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, Palestinian refugees are faced with escalating 13 conflicts and crises in the region, resulting in nearly thirty thousand deaths and 1,900,000 people displaced from their homes; 14 15 and 16 17 WHEREAS, most of UNRWA's regular budget for Gaza pays for the salaries of thirteen thousand employees in the region, 18 19 including teachers, health care specialists, engineers, and 20 sanitation workers; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the total amount of funding that is typical for salaries and operational expenses for UNRWA comes out to 23 \$30,000,000 monthly, according to Juliette Touma, UNRWA Director 24 25 of Communications; and 26 27 WHEREAS, however since the start of the 2023 conflict in 28 Gaza, a supplemental budget for UNRWA increased to 47,000,000 a month from 12,000,000 a month, according to Tom White, Director 29 30 of UNRWA Affairs in Gaza; and

1 WHEREAS, that extra money has paid for flour for three 2 3 hundred fifty thousand families, fourteen million food items, 4 mattress pads, blankets, and kitchen sets, and the distribution 5 of twenty million liters of water; and 6 7 WHEREAS, some of UNRWA's budget in Gaza also goes to 8 distributing life-saving medications, including insulin and 9 vaccines; and 10 WHEREAS, the United States usually gives between 11 12 \$300,000,000 to \$400,000,000 to UNRWA on an annual basis, according to Matthew Miller, Spokesperson for the United States 13 Department of State, which amounts to roughly one-third of the 14 15 agency's annual budget; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the President of the United States has expressed 18 his commitment to promoting human rights and addressing humanitarian crises worldwide; and 19 20 WHEREAS, in January 2023, the United States suspended 21 22 funding to UNRWA amid claims that twelve of its thirteen 23 thousand staff members in Gaza may have abetted extremist 24 activities; and 25 WHEREAS, in response, the United Nations Secretary-General 26 immediately announced the creation of an independent panel to 27 28 investigate the allegations made against UNRWA employees; and 29 30 WHEREAS, suspension of funding to UNRWA by the United 31 States government has severely impacted UNRWA's ability to 32 deliver life-saving assistance to Palestinian refugees; and 33 34 WHEREAS, reinstating funding to UNRWA is essential to 35 ensure the delivery of critical services for Palestinian 36 refugees, such as food, health care, and emergency relief 37 assistance; now, therefore, 38 39 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 40 41 that the President of the United States is urged to promptly 42 reinstate funding for the United Nations Relief and Works Agency

1 for Palestine Refugees in the Near East to support its life-2 saving and critical humanitarian assistance programs for 3 Palestinian refugees; and
