SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGES, AND HAWAII P-20 PARTNERSHIPS FOR EDUCATION TO DEVELOP CLEAR PATHWAYS FOR STUDENTS IN DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION ACADEMIES TO SEAMLESSLY CONTINUE THEIR EDUCATION IN CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS AT UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

WHEREAS, career and technical education programs play an 1 2 important role in Hawaii's economy by providing critical 3 training to the State's future labor force; and 4 WHEREAS, students participating in career and technical 5 6 education programs learn vital skills they need to attain high-skill, high-wage careers in high-demand occupational 7 8 fields; and 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Education offers its students up 10 to thirteen broad continuing and technical education pathways, 11 12 including culture, arts, media, and entertainment; business management, finance, and marketing; health services; information 13 technology and digital transformation; building and 14 construction; advanced manufacturing; energy; architectural 15 design and engineering technology; transportation services; 16 17 agriculture, food, and natural resources; education; hospitality, tourism, and recreation; and law and public safety; 18 19 and 20 21 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii also offers a wide array of continuing and technical education pathways for community 22 college students; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, although both the Department of Education and University of Hawaii offer valuable programs, there is a lack of 26 27 clear coordination between the two educational systems; and 28 WHEREAS, ideally, a Department of Education student 29 participating in a career and technical education academy should 30 31 be able to seamlessly transition into:



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1 2 (1) A University of Hawaii community college career and technical education program following graduation from 3 high school; and 4 5 (2) A career following completion of the community college 6 7 program; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Education and University of Hawaii System should coordinate more closely to allow for these 10 seamless transitions; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Hawaii P-20, whose mission is to strengthen the 13 14 education pipeline from early childhood through postsecondary 15 education and training, is well-positioned to help backwards-map pathways from available careers through the various levels of 16 education and can help students determine when available jobs 17 18 may become available along the pathways; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 21 that the Department of Education, University of Hawaii Community 22 23 Colleges, and Hawaii P-20 are urged to develop clear pathways for students in Department of Education Career and Technical 24 Education Academies to seamlessly continue their education in 25 26 career and technical education programs at University of Hawaii Community Colleges; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Hawaii P-20 is urged to assist with the backwards-mapping of pathways from available jobs 30 through various levels of education and to help students 31 determine points at which they become qualified for available 32 jobs; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education and 35 36 University of Hawaii are both urged to publish the pathways on 37 their respective websites; and 38

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education,
Vice President for Community Colleges of the University of
Hawaii, and Executive Director of Hawaii P-20.
