SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT TO INVENTORY AND MAP EXISTING R-1 WATER DELIVERY SYSTEMS AND RESERVOIRS IN MAUI COUNTY.

WHEREAS, an average of more than 8,700,000 gallons of 1 2 treated wastewater is disposed of every day using injection wells on the island of Maui, causing groundwater contamination, 3 4 algae blooms, and coral reef damage in nearshore waters; and 5 WHEREAS, to prevent and mitigate further environmental 6 7 harm, additional infrastructure is needed for treatment, 8 distribution, and storage of reclaimed water for subsequent use; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the most desirable uses for reclaimed water are 11 for emergency firefighting, and for irrigation of agricultural 12 lands and landscaping; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in August 2023, a wildfire in Lahaina burned an 15 estimated 2,170 acres, killing at least one hundred people, 16 injuring many others, and destroying or damaging approximately 17 two thousand two hundred structures; and 18 19 WHEREAS, it is preferable to use recycled fresh water from 20 reservoirs to fight wildfires, rather than ocean water, because 21 the salinity from ocean water alters the chemical composition of 22 the affected soil, leading to barren landscapes that are unable 23 to support native plant life and experience intensified erosion, 24 which carries the salinized soil to other areas; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, providing firefighters with access to stored reclaimed water with which to fight fires will increase public 28 29 safety and protect affected lands; and 30 WHEREAS, water is a scarce and valued commodity that should 31 not be disposed of without careful consideration; and 32 33 WHEREAS, without increasing the use of reclaimed water in 34 the State, residents will encounter potable drinking water 35

shortages caused by the overuse of potable drinking water for 1 agricultural, landscaping, or firefighting purposes; and 2 3 WHEREAS, using former plantation reservoirs to store 4 5 reclaimed water will allow for easier access for agricultural and landscaping use for West Maui and will provide firefighters 6 with efficient access to fresh water; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, an important first step in increasing the use of 10 reclaimed water is to create accurate inventories and maps of existing R-1 water delivery systems and reservoirs that may be 11 12 used for reclaimed water storage; and 13 WHEREAS, R-1 water refers to water recycled from wastewater 14 that has undergone oxidation, filtration, and disinfection; now, 15 therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 19 that the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development is 20 requested to create an inventory of, and produce maps that 21 identify, existing R-1 water delivery systems and reservoirs on 22 23 the island of Maui; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Planning and 25 Sustainable Development is requested to submit the inventory and 26 maps to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 27 28 convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director of Business, 31 Economic Development, and Tourism; and Director of the Office of 32 Planning and Sustainable Development. 33 34 35 36 OFFERED BY:
