

## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCLUDE THE TEACHING OF FINANCIAL LITERACY IN THE EXISTING PERSONAL TRANSITION PLAN COURSE REQUIREMENT FOR EACH STUDENT.

WHEREAS, in the past, the educational system has assumed 1 that students will learn important financial skills from their 2 families; and 3 4 WHEREAS, not all students are being taught the financial 5 skills they will need to be successful later in life; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the lack of financial literacy in students poses a 8 significant barrier for individuals seeking to achieve financial 9 prosperity and stability; and 10 11 WHEREAS, personal financial education is essential to 12 ensure that the State's youth are prepared to manage money, 13 credit, and debt, and to become responsible workers, heads of 14 15 households, investors, entrepreneurs, business leaders, and citizens; and 16 17 WHEREAS, it is of the upmost importance to educate Hawaii's 18 youth in economic and financial matters to prepare them for 19 financial independence through the development of fiscal 20 responsibility and financial management skills; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, although the Department of Education offers a financial literacy elective course, it is not required; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, some amount of basic skills and knowledge of financial literacy should be required for all students; now, 27 28 therefore, 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 30 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 31 that the Department of Education is urged to include teaching 32 financial literacy in the existing personal transition plan 33 34 course requirement for each student; and 35
