SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY TO INCREASE THE RECYCLING OF CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS AND TO EXPAND THE USAGE OF RECYCLED CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS TO THE GREATEST EXTENT POSSIBLE.

1 WHEREAS, the recycling of construction and demolition debris has substantial benefits to the State; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the increased recycling of construction and 4 demolition debris would help to divert nearly two thousand tons 5 of waste from landfills each day; and 6 7 WHEREAS, many landfills in the State that accept 8 construction and demolition debris are expected to reach maximum 9 capacity within one decade; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, on Oahu, the Waimanalo Gulch Sanitary Landfill, the island's only municipal solid waste landfill, is expected to 13 14 close by 2028; and 15 WHEREAS, on Hawaii Island, the closure of the South Hilo 16 Sanitary Landfill in 2019 has left only the Puuanahulu Landfill 17 remaining; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, Kauai's only landfill, the Kekaha landfill, is expected to become full in 2026; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the landfills on the islands of Maui, Lanai, and 23 Molokai are expected to reach capacity within the next twenty 24 25 years; and 26 WHEREAS, landfills also cause significant impacts to nearby 27 28 communities; and 29 WHEREAS, the residents of communities near landfills, such 30 as Nanakuli and Kekaha, face a proliferation of environmental 31 consequences and reduced property values due to their proximity 32 33 to the landfills; and 34

WHEREAS, the roads serving these communities also must 1 2 unfairly endure the weight of tons of waste being transported from all their island's residents; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, these burdens may be mitigated through an increase in recycling and diversion of construction waste; now, 6 7 therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 10 that Hawaii's construction industry is urged to increase the 11 recycling of construction and demolition debris to the greatest 12 13 extent possible; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii construction 15 16 industry is urged to expand the usage of recycled construction 17 materials to the greatest extent possible; and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Executive Director of the 20 21 General Contractors Association of Hawaii, Executive Secretary-22 Treasurer of the Hawaii Regional Council of Carpenters, and Executive Director of the Hawaii Building and Construction 23 24 Trades Council. 25 26 27
