## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A STATEWIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CURRICULA PLAN FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN GRADES KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE.

WHEREAS, according to a 2021 United States Surgeon 1 General's Advisory on protecting youth mental health, the 2 growing use of digital social media; increased academic 3 4 pressure; limited access to mental health care; health risk 5 behaviors such as drug and alcohol use; broader stressors such as finance, income inequality, and racism, all contribute to the 6 7 upward trend in mental health challenges facing young people; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, a 2021 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention analysis states that nearly forty percent of high school 11 12 students reported experiencing poor mental health during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic and forty-four percent of high 13 school students reported persistent feelings of sadness or 14 15 helplessness in the prior year; and 16 17 WHEREAS, providing behavioral health education in the State's public schools can assist students to better understand 18 their feelings about, and responses to, various situations and 19 where to get help; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 23 that the Department of Education is requested to develop and 24 implement a statewide behavioral health curricula plan for 25 26 public school students in kindergarten through twelfth grade; 27 and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the curriculum include but not be limited to age-appropriate information on: 30 31 32 (1) Mental and emotional health; 33 34 (2) Personal health and wellness; 35
