SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE CONVENE AN ADVISORY COMMISSION TO ADDRESS CERTAIN ISSUES TO GUIDE ACTION AND PROGRESS IN THE AGRICULTURE, AQUACULTURE, AND FOOD SYSTEMS INDUSTRIES OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the overarching goal of the Hawaii Statewide 1 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy is to increase the 2 3 quality of life of its residents and create conditions for all 4 people to thrive and fulfil their potential; and 5 WHEREAS, one of the eight economic industry clusters 6 identified in the Hawaii Statewide Comprehensive Economic 7 8 Development Strategy is agriculture, aquaculture, and food systems; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Statewide Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy's goal for the State's agriculture, 12 aquaculture, and food systems industries is to grow Hawaii's 13 14 agricultural and aquacultural sectors (including non-food production) to diversify the economy, build resilient systems, 15 and increase self-sufficiency while protecting Hawaii's natural 16 and cultural resources through various objectives, such as 17 encouraging the purchase of local agricultural products from 18 state and county governments, businesses, visitors and consumers 19 20 and integrating local agricultural supply chain and infrastructure to increase value chain coordination; and 21 22 WHEREAS, according to section 226-7, Hawaii Revised 23 Statutes, it is the policy of the State to establish a clear 24 25 direction for Hawaii's agriculture through stakeholder commitment and advocacy to achieve the State's agricultural 26 objectives; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, as the State moves toward its self-sufficiency and food security goals, the Legislature finds that an advisory 30 commission is necessary to increase communication; provide 31

expert and credible guidance; and engage strategic partnerships
between the State's private sectors, community leaders, and
relevant stakeholders to support the State's desired increase in



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1 exports and local food production, as well as the overarching goal of creating a sustainable local economy; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 4 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 5 that the Department of Agriculture is requested to establish an 6 advisory commission to address certain issues to guide action 7 and progress in the agriculture, aquaculture, and food systems 8 industries of the State; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory commission is 11 requested to meet twice a year, once in June and once in 12 November, to address certain agriculture, aquaculture, and food 13 systems issues including but not limited to: 14 15 Competition for same resources; 16 (1)17 (2) Labor issues; 18 19 20 (3) Drought and climate change; 21 (4) 22 Invasive species; 23 (5) Overview of new regulations; 24 25 26 (6) Water access and development; and 27 28 (7) Waste management; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory commission is also requested to: 31 32 Examine and rank the following priority actions of the 33 (1)Hawaii State Comprehensive Economic Development 34 Strategy for the State's agriculture, aquaculture, and 35 food systems industries: 36 37 Expand the "Farm to State" Program, government (A) 38 procurement, and institutional purchasing of 39 40 local agricultural products; 41

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governments, businesses, visitors, and consumers and 1 to integrate local agricultural supply chain and 2 infrastructure to increase value chain coordination; 3 4 Review the Department of Agriculture and how it tracks (3) 5 statistics compared to the United States Department of 6 Agriculture; 7 8 (4) Review regulations on existing distribution channels, 9 including food trucks, farm roadside stands, farmers 10 markets, food hubs and farm tours, and barriers in 11 regulation and land use that prevent the State from 12 increasing local food in the State's food supply; and 13 14 Evaluate federal initiatives underway that would (5) 15 impact local producers; getting food from farm to 16 table; the purchase of local agricultural products 17 18 from state and county governments, businesses, visitors, and consumers; and local agricultural supply 19 chains and infrastructure; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of 22 Agriculture, who is requested to serve as the chair of the 23 advisory commission, is requested to invite a representative 24 25 from each of the following segments of agriculture to serve on the advisory commission: 26 27 28 (1)Aquaculture; 29 Harvested acreage, including field crops and taro; 30 (2) 31 32 (3) Vegetables; 33 (4) Fruits; and 34 35 (5) Fruit and nut trees; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of 38 39 Agriculture may invite other individuals with relevant knowledge or experience to be members of the advisory commission; and 40 41



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no member be made subject to 1 chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statues, solely because of that 2 member's participation in the advisory commission; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture is requested to provide administrative support to the advisory 6 7 commission; and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 9 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 11 Agriculture. 12 13 14 OFFERED BY:
