## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH A MULTIAGENCY WORKING GROUP TO UPDATE THE MAPS, TIER TABLES, AND INVENTORIES OF STATE LANDS SUITABLE AND AVAILABLE FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has had an affordable housing shortage for 1 decades, being one of the most expensive states in the nation 2 regarding housing, with median housing costs almost three times 3 higher than the national average; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a 2015 report by the Department of Business, 6 Economic Development, and Tourism titled "Measuring Housing 7 Demand in Hawaii, 2015-2025" projected that housing demand will 8 exceed sixty thousand units, with nearly seventy percent needed 9 for households earning eighty percent or less of the Area Median 10 Income; and 11 12 WHEREAS, while there have been various legislative efforts 13 made regarding the housing shortage including Act 127, Session 14 15 Laws of Hawaii 2016, which established the Special Action Team on Affordable Rental Housing to catalog and prioritize publicly 16 owned parcels based on their access to infrastructure, the 17 housing shortage has only worsened since the conclusion of the 18 19 Special Action Team's investigation; and 20 WHEREAS, the Affordable Rental Housing Report and Ten-Year 21 Plan, published in 2018 by the Special Action Team on Affordable 22 Rental Housing, identified parcels of land within each county 23 suitable for much needed affordable housing development; and 24 25 WHEREAS, statewide, unless the planning, funding, and 26 delivery of affordable rental housing becomes an overarching 27 priority for the Legislature, Governor, mayors, housing 28 agencies, developers, and public and private funding sources, 29 seventy percent of Hawaii's families will soon be excluded from 30 affordable, safe, and sanitary housing; now, therefore, 31 32
