## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO PRIORITIZE REMEDIATION OF THE FLOODING ISSUES PRESENT ON ROUTE 11 AROUND MILE POST SIXTY AS A SAFETY PROJECT. WHEREAS, there is well-documented flooding on Route 11 near 1 Mile Post 60, on Hawaii Island; and 2 3 WHEREAS, flooding frequently causes the highway to close; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, Route 11 is a portion of Mamalahoa Highway that acts as the main artery into the southern tip of the island, and 8 is also the only route that connects the two main towns of the 9 Ka'ū district; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the closure of this highway poses a major safety 12 issue for the surrounding residents, being their lifeline to 13 medical services and an emergency evacuation route; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the highway was constructed before 1962 and lacks 16 drainage elements within this low-lying section; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, Mamalahoa Highway has closed at least six times since 2012 due to flooding; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the Legislature has previously included funds for maintenance of this highway in the budget and attempted to pass 23 remedial legislation; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Department of Transportation has considered 26 27 installing flood monitoring systems and raising the highway as 28 much as ten feet and installing culverts; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 31 that the Department of Transportation is requested to prioritize 32 33 remediation of the flooding issues present on Route II around Mile Post 60 as a safety project; and 34 35
