SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO RESEARCH AND CONVENE STAKEHOLDER DISCUSSIONS TO CONSIDER THE CONCEPT OF A WILDFIRE INSURANCE COMPACT.

WHEREAS, the State is facing the increasing challenge of 1 wildfires, which has been exacerbated by climate change that is 2 responsible for more intense and more frequent extreme events 3 such as wildfires, storms, droughts, and floods; and 4 5 WHEREAS, wildfires pose significant risks to the health, 6 safety, and welfare of the State's residents, visitors, and 7 businesses; and 8 9 WHEREAS, on August 8, 2023, swift moving wildfires fueled 10 by dry grass and spread by strong winds from a passing hurricane 11 wiped out almost the entire town of Lahaina in west Maui, in the 12 nation's deadliest wildfire in more than a century; and 13 14 WHEREAS, at least one hundred fifteen people lost their 15 life in the fire, over two thousand two hundred buildings were 16 destroyed and another five hundred damaged, resulting in 17 property losses in the billions of dollars; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the impacts from the August 2023 Maui wildfire 20 were devastating to the west Maui community and have been felt 21 throughout the entire State; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the recovery is expected to be long and arduous; 24 25 and 26 27 WHEREAS, the aftermath of the deadly August 2023 Maui wildfire poses a significant strain on local insurance companies 28 and communities; and 29 30 WHEREAS, there are concerns that the wildfires could 31 trigger insurance companies to reevaluate the risks associated 32 with offering coverage to homeowners in Hawaii, which has long 33

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1 been considered a relatively stable market compared to other states; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the increased risk of wildfires and the resulting 4 challenges for insurance companies means the State should 5 explore a coordinated approach to mitigate and manage these 6 risks; now, therefore, 7 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 10 that the Insurance Commissioner is requested to research and 11 convene stakeholder discussions to consider the concept of a 12 Wildfire Insurance Compact with strategic partner states that 13 have similar wildfire risks or robust disaster management 14 systems; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the research and discussions 17 are requested to consider a Wildfire Insurance Compact that 18 focuses primarily on risk pooling and informational technology 19 20 sharing to mitigate and share the risks and costs associated with wildfires; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is 23 24 requested to research and discuss with stakeholders any necessary legislation that can assist in the funding of policies 25 and programs available through a Wildfire Insurance Compact 26 through taxes or surcharges on existing taxes; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is 29 requested to research and discuss with stakeholders policies and 30 programs offered by a Wildfire Insurance Compact that would 31 directly benefit vulnerable populations and communities; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Insurance Commissioner. 35
