SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TELEHEALTH WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE IMPACT OF WIDESPREAD TELEHEALTH ADOPTION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND IDENTIFY PUBLIC POLICY INITIATIVES AT THE FEDERAL AND STATE LEVEL TO OPTIMIZE TELEHEALTH UTILIZATION AS THE STATE TRANSITIONS OUT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

1 WHEREAS, the State experienced an increase in the use of 2 telehealth during the coronavirus disease 19 (COVID-19) pandemic 3 by a factor of sixty-five and has remained at that level, which 4 is well above the pre-COVID-19 pandemic usage; and 5

6 WHEREAS, telehealth adoption was most significant with 7 direct-to-consumer video visits on personal devices and audio-8 only telephone visits, often without important elements of the 9 physical exam or vital signs being obtained during the visit; 10 and

WHEREAS, although there is some data to support the safety, efficacy, timeliness, access, and cost effectiveness of telehealth, the impact of widespread telehealth adoption in the State is largely unknown; and

WHEREAS, although telehealth (video and audio) visits may improve short-term access to and timeliness of health care, there may be adverse long-term consequences if patients are not seen in person for physical examination, lab work, vital signs, and other in-clinic testing; and

WHEREAS, a full evaluation of the impact of widespread telehealth adoption in the State on safety, utilization, total cost of care, and patient and provider satisfaction to determine how best to integrate telehealth into in-person practice as the State transitions out of the COVID-19 pandemic would provide the State with greater insight into existing telehealth challenges and benefits; and
