SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAI'I CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION AND ADAPTATION COMMISSION TO CONDUCT AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM REGARDING THE ACTIVITIES OF INDIVIDUALS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO CLIMATE CHANGE.

WHEREAS, climate change is a serious danger which threatens 1 to have a significant impact on the State, the United States, 2 and the world; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, climate change is caused by the accumulation of carbon within the atmosphere, which is substantially worsened by 6 the consumption of fossil fuels; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, many people recognize the threats posed by climate change and wish to minimize their personal contribution to the 10 buildup of carbon in the atmosphere; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, though a single person's actions make only a small difference in the matter of global warming, the total of actions 14 taken by many people makes a significant difference; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, it is not always intuitive or obvious which actions a person or group of people can take to reduce their 18 19 carbon footprint; and 20 WHEREAS, the executive director of Project Drawdown, a 21 nonprofit, non-partisan organization that advances effective, 22 science-based climate solutions and strategies; fosters bold, 23 new climate leadership; and promotes new narratives and new 24 voices to help the world stop climate change, has said that 25 there have been efforts from industry to mislead customers about 26 27 what is most effective at mitigating climate change; and 28 29 WHEREAS, according to a Washington Post-University of Maryland (Post-UMD) poll, fifty-nine percent of Americans 30 believe that recycling will have a lot or some impact on climate 31 change, while a study led by a University of Leeds researcher 32 found that the climate change impact of recycling is second-to-33 34 last among more than fifty actions; and

1 WHEREAS, according to the same Post-UMD poll, only twenty-2 four percent of Americans believe that not eating meat will have 3 4 a lot or some impact on climate change, while Project Drawdown 5 estimates that three-quarters of people around the world adopting a plant-rich diet by 2050 could avoid the release of 6 more than one hundred gigatons of emissions; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, according to the same Post-UMD poll, only thirtyone percent of Americans believe that living in a smaller house 10 or apartment will have a lot or some impact on climate change, 11 while the director of Stanford University's Woods Institute for 12 the Environment, an interdisciplinary research lab that supports 13 environmental research, has stated that a home's carbon 14 15 footprint is often proportionate to its size; now, therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, 18 that the Hawai'i Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation 19 Commission is requested to conduct an educational program 20 21 regarding the activities of individuals that contribute to 22 climate change; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the educational program is 25 requested to: 26 27 (1)Inform people of which personal activities, habits, and lifestyle choices create the greatest contribution 28 29 to an individual's carbon footprint; and 30 31 (2) Make use of printed fliers; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawai'i Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission is requested to coordinate 34 with the Department of Health in the implementation of the 35 36 educational program; and 37
