<u>HB 2140, HD1</u>	RELATING TO ORNAMENTAL GINGER.	AGR, HET, FIN
(HSCR172-24) Status	Appropriates funds for statewide research into ornamental ginger pathogens, prevention of the spread of ornamental ginger pathogens, production and distribution of pathogen-free ornamental ginger plants, and outreach to ornamental producers. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	
<u>HB 2138, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR171-24)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION. Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii for the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources to establish an agriculture education coordinator position. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	AGR, HET, FIN



HB 1931 Status	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Appropriates funds for salaries and fringe benefits of positions for the University of Hawaii Institute for Astronomy's Space Sciences Workforce Development Program, Maunakea Scholars Program, and Akamai Internship Program. Appropriates funds for office equipment and supplies for the Maunakea Scholars Program and Akamai Internship Program.	HET, FIN
HB 2153 Status	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Establishes an air and space law program at the William S. Richardson School of Law at the University of Hawaii. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.	HET, FIN
HB 2719 Status	RELATING TO POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION. Establishes a pilot program to offer tuition waivers for certain community college students starting in fall 2025. Requires the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii to submit a report.	HET, FIN
<u>HB 2720, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR214-24)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Establishes a collective bargaining unit for graduate assistants employed by the University of Hawaii and its community college system. Exempts graduate assistants from collective bargaining until they petition the Hawaii Labor Relations Board and the Board determines the graduate assistants are ready to be placed in a bargaining unit. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	LGO, HET, FIN
HB 1588, HD1 (HSCR275-24) Status	RELATING TO THE LABOR EDUCATION ADVISORY COUNCIL. Specifies that the Labor Education Advisory Council shall be advisory to the President of the University of Hawaii on all activities and programs of the Center for Labor Education and Research. Requires written responses addressing the Council's advice and adoption of resolutions by the President and Chancellor of the University of Hawaii, West Oahu campus. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	LGO, HET

HB 1788RELATING TO THE TAX CREDIT FOR RESEARCH ACTIVITIES. HET, FINStatusAdds a cap for the amount of tax credits for research activities that an
eligible taxpayer and the taxpayer's related entities may receive per
taxable year. Consolidates the survey and certification requirements
for tax credits for research activities. Amends the annual aggregate
cap on tax credits for research activities that the Department of
Business, Economic Development, and Tourism may certify. Requires
certification of the tax credits for research activities on a first-come,
first-served basis to be based on the date that a complete application is
received, subject to certain conditions. Extends from 12/31/2024 to
12/31/2029, the sunset date for tax credits for research activities.

<u>Status</u>	Establishes the Institute of Indigenous Education, Science, and	
	Outreach within the University of Hawaii at Hilo.

<u>SB 1511, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR1022)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Clarifies the purpose of the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii and that its undertakings shall be limited to acts that are reasonably necessary to carry out its purpose. Repeals the requirement that the University of Hawaii contract with the Research Corporation when the University determines that other various agencies cannot more effectively or efficiently accomplish certain research and training activities. Grandfathers existing Research Corporation contracts and requires new contracts be subject to new limitations. Limits the scope of the special account the Research Corporation is authorized to establish. Requires revolving accounts to follow University of Hawaii Administrative Procedure 12.204. Limits internal service orders and revolving accounts of the Research Corporation that use University intramural funds to certain projects and requires biannual reports to the Legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	HET, FIN
<u>HB 1802</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII REVENUE BONDS. Authorizes the board of regents of the university of Hawaii to issue revenue bonds for the purpose of financing capital improvement projects.	HET, FIN
HB 1784 Status	RELATING TO TAXATION. For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2023, temporarily reinstates the Technology Infrastructure Renovation Tax Credit and expands the definition of "technology-enabled infrastructure" to include data servers.	HET, FIN
HB 2710 Status	RELATING TO TELECOMMUNICATIONS. Requires a wireless telecommunications carrier, as a condition for any conservation district use permit to construct, reconstruct, or alter a telecommunications facility on Kaiwa ridge, to maintain emergency backup power for a minimum of eight hours.	HET, CPC
