RELATING TO FUNDING FOR THE TOBACCO HB 2341 **Status**

ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL FUND.

Amends the amount of funding for the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund administered by the Department of the Attorney General by amending the amount of funds that the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund can carry over at the end of the fiscal year; increasing the cigarette tax stamp fee and concurrently increasing the percentage of the cigarette tax stamp fee deposited to the Tobacco Enforcement Special Fund; and amending the amount of funds to be deposited to the credit of the Tobacco **Enforcement Special Fund from tobacco settlement moneys.**

Effective 7/1/2024.

HB 1675 RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. HLT, FIN

Status Beginning 1/1/2025, exempts medical services provided by

> physicians and advanced practice registered nurses acting in the capacity of a primary care provider from the general excise tax.

RELATING TO HOSPITALS. **HB 1793**

HLT, CPC

Status Directs the Department of Health to include in its rules addressing

hospital licensure a requirement that each hospital holding a license from the Department of Health have security personnel in

certain locations at all times.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
