Creates a state-initiated process to expunge records of arrests and convictions for the offense of promoting a detrimental drug in the third degree at no cost to the record holder. Requires the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center to submit biannual reports to the Legislature until all eligible records are expunged. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	JDC, WAM
HB 1608, HD2 (HSCR942-24) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER. Appropriates funds for deputy public defender positions within the Office of the Public Defender and requires that one of the positions be assigned to the family court section. Effective 7/1/3000. HB 1674, HD1 (HSCR851-24) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Authorizes candidates and their candidate committees to donate residual campaign funds to the general fund of the State or to the real property tax general fund of any county of the State. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	JDC, WAM
HB 1881, HD1 (HSCR937-24) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE FINES. Updates the maximum administrative fines allowed for violations of chapters relating to standards of conduct and lobbyists. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)	JDC, WAM

SECTION 3 JDC, WAM HB 2509, HD1 OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO INCREASE THE (HSCR728-24) MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE FOR STATE JUSTICES AND JUDGES.
