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HB 2478 RELATING TO THE PACIFIC MARINE FISHERIES COMPACT. WAL, JHA

Status Authorizes the Governor to execute a compact on behalf of the State to

cooperate in the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission.

Establishes procedures for selection and succession of commissioners.

HB 2479 RELATING TO THE TAKING OF MARINE DEPOSITS. WAL, JHA

Status Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources to approve

permits for research, education, management, or propagation purposes that include the taking of sand, dead coral, coral rubble, rocks, soil, and

other marine deposits seaward of the shoreline.

HB 1554 Status

RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES.

WAL, JHA

Expands the department of land and natural resources' rulemaking authority to include any rule deemed necessary to protect certain aquatic life. Expands the board of land and natural resources' authority to temporarily adopt, amend, or repeal certain natural resource rules by formal action at a publicly noticed meeting if the board finds that such adoption, amendment, or repeal is necessary to implement effective and adaptive management measures in light of newly available technology, or in light of newly available data.

HB 1546 Status

RELATING TO RESTORATION OF BEACH LANDS.

WAL, JHA

Amends the definition of "beach restoration" used in laws governing the Board of Land and Natural Resources' powers to engage in beach restoration to include activities undertaken to improve eroded beaches and degraded dune systems and to remove abandoned and remnant manmade materials that pose a risk to the health of the public and ecosystem.

HB 2180 **Status**

RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT.

Prohibits development in special management areas unless the development is first found to not be located in a sea level rise exposure

area.

HB 2693 Status

RELATING TO HISTORIC AND CULTURAL PRESERVATION.

Establishes the Cultural Corridor Authority to develop plans to redevelop areas affected by disaster while maintaining historic and cultural preservation. Establishes an income tax credit to incentivize the voluntary relinquishment of real property located in areas affected by disaster. Directs the Attorney General to commence eminent domain proceedings for certain purposes. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund

expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB 2694 Status

RELATING TO WATER RESOURCES.

WAL, JHA, FIN

WAL, JHA

WAL, CPC

Establishes an income tax credit to incentivize the voluntary relinquishment of private water systems. Directs the Attorney General to commence eminent domain proceedings in certain counties. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB 2476 **Status**

RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION MANAGEMENT.

Designates all ocean waters of the State within 3,000 feet from shore as ocean recreation management areas (ORMAs). Prohibits commercial activity in ORMAs unless authorized by use permit. Prohibits commercial activities in ORMAs on weekends and state and federal holidays unless authorized by the Board of Land and Natural

Resources.

<u>HB 2475</u> Status

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL OCEAN ACTIVITY.

Includes advertisements and offers in the definition of "commercial activity" as used in chapter 200, HRS. Provides that advertisements or offers for commercial activity are prima facie evidence that the owner disseminated or directed dissemination of such advertisements or

offers.

HB 1919 Status

RELATING TO STATE BOATING FACILITIES.

WAL, FIN

Establishes a state boating facility lease pilot program within the Department of Land and Natural Resources to lease one state small boat harbor for private development, management, maintenance, and operation in a county with a population of less than 900,000. Repeals provisions related to the leasing of fast lands and submerged lands of the Ala Wai boat harbor. Repeals on 6/30/2044.

HB 1809 RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION COMMERCIAL PERMITS. WAL, JHA, FIN

Status Requires that any newly established ocean recreation management area include the same or greater number of commercial use permits as the

include the same or greater number of commercial use permits as the number of permits applicable to the area before the establishment of

the ocean recreation management area.

HB 2477 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL OCEAN RECREATION WAL, FIN

Status OPERATIONS.

Specifies that the Department of Land and Natural Resources can issue new ocean recreation commercial use permits by unsealed public auction. Revises provisions relating to boating and ocean recreation fees and permits. Specifies how commercial use permits may be

issued where a permit limit has been exceeded.

HB 2626 RELATING TO FISHPONDS. WAL, JHA, FIN

Status Appropriates funds to the Board of Land and Natural Resources to create a standard lease application and programmatic environmental impact statement to streamline the process of leasing government-

impact statement to streamline the process of leasing governmentowned Hawaiian fishponds, prioritizing community co-managed

organizations and projects.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, written submissions will be considered by the committee.
