HB2195 RELATING TO BUILDING INDUSTRY PROFESSIONALS.

Repeals the discretion for public officials to require work in respect to any structure or improvement, regardless of the cost valuation of the work, to be subject to the requirements of professional engineers, architects, surveyors, and landscape architects licensing laws. Maintains that work in respect to structures within special management areas, flood hazard areas, and special design districts and in respect to improvements resulting from conditional use or other discretionary zoning permits, code compliances or variances, and building permit expediting procedures, are subject to the licensing laws.

HB2196 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT.

Removes requirement of a college degree for any state position, unless the degree is relevant to licensing or certification as it relates to the duties and responsibilities of the position.

HB2197 RELATING TO HAWAII RETIREMENT SAVINGS ACT.

LGO, FIN

Clarifies the definition of "covered employer" under the Hawaii Retirement Savings Act. Requires covered employers to automatically enroll covered employees into the Hawaii Retirement Savings Program unless the employee chooses to opt out.

HB2198 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT.

LGO, JHA, FIN

Allows public employee organizations to negotiate retirement benefits.

HB2199 RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

LGO, JHA

Amends Chapter 202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be consistent with the General Appropriations Act of 2021, Act 88, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021. Renames "Hawaii Workforce Development Council" to "Hawaii Workforce Development Board". Requires the Hawaii Workforce Development Board and local workforce development boards to develop written conflict of interest policies consistent with federal law and regulations. Requires the Governor to select the chairperson of the board from among the seventeen private sector members. Requires the Hawaii Workforce Development Board to assist the Governor in coordinating local workforce development boards to improve the workforce development system. Repeals the requirement for the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to submit an annual report to the Legislature on the activities of the K-12 Agriculture Workforce Development Pipeline Initiative.

<u>HB2200</u> RELATING TO STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS FOR THE HET, LGO, FIN

ELDERLY.

Establishes a student loan forgiveness program within the University of Hawaii to forgive outstanding student loans of elders who have graduated from an institution of higher education in the United States and have worked for at least 10 years in public service. Requires the Employees' Retirement System to assist applicants with demonstrating proof of public employment. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB2201 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. WAL/EEP, JHA

Generally prohibits the removal of minerals from the seabed in all state marine waters. Prohibits the issuance of permits for the mooring, docking, or operation of any vessel designed or intended for removal of minerals from the seabed. Provides for exceptions relating to beach replenishment, research purposes, and native Hawaiian cultural practices.

HB2202 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW

JHA, FIN

ENFORCEMENT.

Takes effect only upon ratification of constitutional amendment requiring the election of the Sheriff as the single executive of the Department of Law Enforcement. Effective 1/1/2025, amends elections law to accommodate the election of the Sheriff. Effective 12/1/2026, makes statutory amendments to make administrative changes to the Department.

HB2203 RELATING TO HAWAII EMERGENCY HOME SALES

CPC, JHA

MORATORIUM.

Establishes a temporary restriction that only current and former residents of Hawaii may purchase residential property. Prohibits real estate brokers and real estate salespersons from buying, offering to buy, or negotiating the purchase of residential real estate for someone who is not a current or former resident without disclosing the temporary restriction. Repeals the moratorium when the Governor's last proclamation on affordable housing expires.

HB2204 RELATING TO HOUSING.

WAL/HSG, JHA

Provides that a project may not proceed under an emergency proclamation relating to housing or affordable housing if that project includes any construction, development, redevelopment, or adaptive reuse that results in a new luxury housing unit or the conversion of an existing residential unit to a luxury housing unit.

HB2205 PROPOSING TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE

STATE OF HAWAII WITH RESPECT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT.

Proposes to amend the Constitution of the State of Hawaii by: (1) Providing that the Department of Law Enforcement shall be headed by an elected Sheriff; (2) Applying to the Sheriff the same constitutional impeachment and removal provisions that apply to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor; (3) Providing that vacancies shall be filled as provided by law; and (4) Removing the Department from the supervision of the Governor.

HB2206 RELATING TO LIQUOR INSURANCE.

CPC/JHA

JHA, FIN

Removes the requirement that establishments holding specific classes of liquor licenses maintain liquor liability insurance.

HB2207 RELATING TO LIQUOR.

CPC/JHA

Authorizes persons to apply for a permit to act as solicitors or representatives of licensed wineries, brewpubs, and small craft producer pubs any county of the State.

HB2208 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR

OR FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE THIRD REPRESENTATIVE

DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the third

representative district.

HB2209 RELATING TO LIQUOR LICENSES.

CPC/JHA

Authorizes liquor sold through a class 10 license to be consumed

on or off the premises.

HB2210 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

WAL, JHA

Clarifies that powers granted for emergency purposes shall not be inconsistent with the state constitution. Clarifies that emergency powers shall not be used to address issues arising out of existing economic pressures. Provides for greater clarity and specificity regarding the scope of suspensions of law. Authorizes the Governor to require the counties to obtain approval before issuing any emergency order, rule, or proclamation. Clarifies the legal framework governing the extension and termination of emergency periods. Allows the Legislature to terminate a state of emergency or local state of emergency. Clarifies that the Governor may re-declare a state of emergency that has been terminated. Specifies when certain prohibitions during an emergency or a severe warning expire. Defines "severe"

warning".

HB2211 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION.

LGO, FIN

Prohibits a board or commission from authorizing a base salary for a position and prohibits an employee from receiving a base salary, in excess of the amount designated in the budget enacted by the Legislature or other legislative enactment, unless

approved by the Legislature.

HB2212 RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

HSG/WAL, JHA

Allows religious, educational, and medical institutions to build residential units on lands zoned for residential or commercial use within the urban state land use district, under certain conditions.

HB2213 RELATING TO THE CONTRACTOR REPAIR ACT.

CPC, JHA

Expands the required contents of a notice of claim of construction defect served on a contractor. Requires the claimant to provide actual evidence of the nature and cause of the construction defect and extent of necessary repairs along with the notice of claim. Amends the process and timeframe for a claimant to accept a contractor's proposal to inspect and authorize the contractor to proceed with repairs. Limits the amount a claimant can recover if the claimant unreasonably rejects a contractor's proposal to inspect or an offer to remedy.

HB2214 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG, WAL, FIN

Provides a new source of interim financing for affordable housing projects using housing programs under chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Sunsets 7/1/2029. Effective 1/1/2025.

HB2215 RELATING TO MEDICAID.

HUS, FIN

Appropriates funds to increase the funding of certain medicaid home and community-based services, including case management services for home and community-based case management agencies and residential services offered in community care foster family homes and expanded adult residential care homes. Requires the Department of Human Services to obtain matching funds.

HB2216 RELATING TO CARE HOMES.

HUS. FIN

Increases the cap on state supplemental payments for type I adult residential care homes, licensed developmental disabilities domiciliary homes, community care foster family homes, and certified adult foster homes and type II adult residential care homes.

HB2217 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HUS, FIN

Requires the Departments of Health, Human Services, and Education to research any rules, policies, and state plan amendments that are necessary to ensure that clinically appropriate treatments and services for individuals twenty-six years of age or younger with autism spectrum disorder or fetal alcohol spectrum disorder are considered covered benefits under the State's medicaid program. Appropriates funds.

HB2218 RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION HSG, JHA, FIN

ACT.

Increases the loan limit for direct loans provided by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to 75% of the maximum single residence loan amount allowed in Hawaii by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's Federal Housing Administration, instead of 50%, as currently outlined in section 215 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended. Takes effect on either the date of the Secretary of the Interior's notification that congressional approval of this Act is unnecessary, or on the date of consent by the United States Congress.

RELATING TO THE COMMISSION ON WATER HB2219

WAL, JHA

RESOURCE MANAGEMENT.

Increases the number of Commission on Water Resource Management members from 7 to 8, with only 5 of the 8 members required to have substantial experience in water resource management. Adds the Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, or the Chairperson's designee, as a member of the Commission on Water Resource Management.

HB2220 RELATING TO GAMBLING. JHA

Provides that a defendant may not assert social gambling as an affirmative defense if the gambling activity occurred at the defendant's residence and gambling activities have resulted in multiple recent documented noise complaints.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CANCER RESEARCH HB2221

FIN

SPECIAL FUND.

Appropriates a percentage of the tobacco settlement moneys to the Hawaii cancer research special fund.

RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB2222

EDN, FIN

Requires the department of education to convene a staggered school start times task force to study and evaluate the issues and implications of instituting a staggered school start times program, including effects on school bus schedules. Requires a report to the legislature. Appropriates funds.

HB2223 RELATING TO INSURANCE. HLT, CPC, FIN

Beginning 1/1/2025, requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to provide

coverage for biomarker testing.

REFERRAL HB2224 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE. HUS, FIN Requires the Executive Office on Aging to create a comprehensive long-term care master plan to accomplish longterm care policy goals that, when implemented, ensure the availability of a full continuum of institutional and communitybased services. Establishes a long-term care planner position within the EOA to oversee the development and implementation of the long-term care master plan. Requires the EOA to submit a report to the Legislature. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO VETERANS RIGHTS AND BENEFITS. CMV, CPC HB2225 Prohibits persons from receiving compensation for advising or assisting with veterans benefits. RELATING TO CORRECTIONS. HB2226 CMV, FIN Requires the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to establish a two-year pilot program to allow inmates incarcerated at the women's community correctional center to foster pets while incarcerated. Requires DCR to submit a report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. HB2227 RELATING TO CHILD CARE. HUS/CMV, JHA Expands the existing state exemption for United States Department of Defense-certified providers to those operating off federal property. HB2228 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS CMV/LGO, FIN AND REHABILITATION. Requires the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to establish a pilot program to allow inmates to perform work for the State. Sunsets on 6/30/2026. HB2229 RELATING TO SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREA PERMITS. HSG, JHA Amends the definition of "development", in section 205A-22, HRS, to clarify that "development" does not include construction or reconstruction of a single-family residence that is less than 7,500 square feet of floor area and is not part of a larger development, even if the residence is located on a shoreline parcel or a parcel that is impacted by waves, storm surges, high tide, or shoreline erosion. RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. HB2230 JHA, FIN Requires the Law Enforcement Standards Board to develop, and each department employing law enforcement officers to implement, a structured health intervention program to support

Prohibits private and state workforce development programs from rejecting an applicant who is 18 years of age or younger based solely on the applicant's active sentence of probation; provided that the applicant is in full compliance with any court-ordered requirements or conditions.	LGO, JHA
<u>HB2234</u>	RELATING TO CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES. Requires and appropriates moneys for the Judiciary to develop a 3-year civil legal services pilot program to provide civil legal services at no cost to eligible parties. Requires reports to the Legislature prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2025, 2026, and 2027. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.	JHA, FIN
<u>HB2235</u>	RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS. Reclassifies or repeals certain non-general funds of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, pursuant to the recommendations made by the Auditor in Auditor's Report No. 23-06.	FIN
<u>HB2236</u>	RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS. Reclassifies, repeals, or abolishes certain non-general funds of the Department of Agriculture, pursuant to the recommendations made by the Auditor in Auditor's Report No. 23-13.	FIN

HB2247 JHA/AGR, HLT, Extends the date after which primary caregivers will no longer be FIN authorized to cultivate cannabis for a qualifying patient to 12/31/2026. Appropriates funds to the university of Hawaii sea grant college program to develop a north shore beach management plan for the north shore of Oahu from Sunset point to the Kapo'o (Sharks Cove) area. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION. HB2249 WAL, JHA Clarifies that violation of part I of chapter 200, HRS, relating to ocean recreation and coastal areas, or any rules adopted thereunder shall be subject to criminal penalties. RELATING TO CRISIS INTERVENTION. JHA, FIN HB2250 Requires the Department of Law Enforcement to coordinate crisis intervention training for state and county law enforcement agencies and crisis intervention officers. Requires the Department of Health to certify crisis intervention officers. Defines "crisis intervention officer". Authorizes crisis intervention officers to order persons determined to be imminently dangerous to themselves or others to be transported to a designated behavioral health crisis center. Establishes positions. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes an appropriation. RELATING TO NOISE POLLUTION. HB2251 TRN, CPC Establishes a separate prohibition on driving motor vehicles having noisy mufflers on public highways in high-density areas. Authorizes police officers to conduct examinations and inspections of motor vehicle mufflers in high-density areas. Establishes separate fines for mopeds having noisy exhaust pipes or mufflers that are driven in high-density areas. Defines "highdensity areas".

Establishes the offense of habitual violent misdemeanor crime.

RELATING TO CRIME.

HB2252

HB2253 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, JHA

Requires law enforcement officers to carry an opioid antagonist while on-duty. Authorizes law enforcement officers to administer an opioid antagonist. Establishes immunity for law enforcement officers who administer an opioid antagonist during an opioid-related drug overdose. Requires Department of Health to establish education and training for law enforcement personnel. Requires the Department of Health to require that all restaurants and hotel establishments maintain an inventory of naloxone.

HB2254 RELATING TO EMPLOYEES.

LGO, FIN

Allows state departments to participate in temporary employee interchanges with private sector organizations, including nonprofit and for-profit organizations. Limits the term for a temporary employee interchange with a private sector organization to no more than four continuous months.

HB2255 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-NINTH REPRESENTATIVE

FIN

DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the fortyninth representative district.

HB2256 RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS.

EDN, FIN

Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, requires the Department of Education to provide free breakfast and lunch to students enrolled in a public school who meet certain requirements. Appropriates funds.

HB2257 RELATING TO PUBLIC EDUCATION.

HET/EDN, FIN

Establishes the Public Education Scholarship Program within the University of Hawaii to provide students who are residents of the State with scholarships in return for a service commitment to teach in a public school classroom of the Department of Education or Hawaii public charter school, under certain conditions. Appropriates funds.

HB2258 RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LGO, FIN

Transfers the rights, powers, functions, duties, resources, and individual budget of the department of education relating to workers' compensation for its employees from the department of education to the department of human resources development.

<u>HB2259</u> RELATING TO GAMING.

ECD, CPC/JHA,

FIN

Authorizes a 10-year license for one entity to operate online poker and sportsbook betting. Establishes the Hawaii gaming control commission. Imposes wagering tax on gross receipts. Creates the state gaming fund and compulsive gambler assistance program. Allocates 70% of profits received by the State to certain wildfire victims with the percentage decreasing 5% each year.

HB2260 RELATING TO GAMING.

ECD, CPC/JHA,

FIN

Authorizes a 10-year license for 1 poker and sportsbook gaming facility in a special district designated for tourism in a county with over 500,000 residents and that is not in a hotel. Allows admission for individuals 21 years of age or older. Establishes the Hawaii gaming control commission. Imposes wagering tax on gross receipts. Creates the state gaming fund and compulsive gambler assistance program. Allocates to the State an amount equal to 70% of profits, with the percentage decreasing 5% each year. Authorizes the State to make grants from revenue received to a nonprofit entity for the benefit of wildfire victims.

<u>HB2261</u> RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

HSG/WAL, JHA

Amends the definition of "historic property" used in historic preservation laws to remove the minimum age and require listing on the Hawaii or national register of historic places or built before August 21, 1959. Broadens exclusions from historic review for certain types of proposed projects on existing privately-owned single-family detached dwelling units or townhouses.

HB2262 RELATING TO AQUACULTURE.

AGR, JHA

Prohibits certain octopus aquaculture.

HB2263 RELATING TO THE EAST KAUAI IRRIGATION SYSTEM.

WAL, FIN

Appropriates funds to the Agribusiness Development Corporation to establish positions to maintain and improve the East Kauai irrigation system and for maintenance of and

improvements to the system.

HB2264 RELATING TO CESSPOOLS.

EEP/WAL, FIN

Establishes a three-year new wastewater system demonstration and implementation pilot program within the University of

Hawaii Sea Grant College.

<u>HB2265</u> RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES.

WAL/CPC, JHA,

Establishes and implements the Catastrophic Wildfire FIN

Securitization Act, to allow public utilities to securitize rates in order to raise capital that can be used to pay for costs and

expenses arising out of catastrophic wildfires.

JHA, FIN

RELATING TO TORT LIABILITY.

Permanently reinstates the liability protections previously afforded to county lifeguards providing services at state beach

parks or in the ocean.

HB2267 RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

HB2266

TRN, JHA, FIN

Establishes the Automated Speed Enforcement Systems Program. Authorizes the state or counties to administer the Automated Speed Enforcement Systems Program. Requires fines collected beginning 1/1/2025 for violations on a county highway to be expended for the operation of the Automated Speed Enforcement Systems Program. Creates a new offense of noncompliance with the posted speed limit under the Automated

Speed Enforcement System. Appropriates funds.

HB2268 RELATING TO WATER QUALITY.

WAL/EEP, JHA

Clarifies the level of environmental restoration owners and operators of underground storage tanks or tank systems that had a confirmed release must satisfy by requiring the removal of all jet fuel, including fuel additives and all compounds resulting from the degradation of jet fuel or jet fuel additives or the reaction of jet fuel or jet fuel additives with water or other chemicals. Establishes a rebuttable presumption that the detection of these contaminants in the vicinity of an underground storage tank or a tank system after a confirmed release is a result of the confirmed

release.

<u>HB2269</u> RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

JHA, FIN

Requires the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to conduct a study on the potential impacts of permitting the sale of

aerial devices in the State.

HB2270 RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF

TRN, FIN

TRANSPORTATION.

Establishes a task force to develop and explore alternate routes into and out of the Waianae Coast, including through Kolekole pass and opening Waianae Coast emergency access road.

HUS, FIN

Repeals language that gives the Director of Finance discretion to use moneys in the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund if the Director elects to accept deposits from contributors instead of sending deposits directly to the ABLE program manager. Authorizes the Director of Finance to expend moneys in the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund to provide incentive payments to Hawaii public school ABLE account owners. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Budget and Finance to fund the incentive payments. Makes an appropriation to the Department of Health for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent position within the State Council on Developmental Disabilities to provide statewide outreach, advocacy, and relationship management for the Hawaii ABLE savings program.

HB2285 RELATING TO PROVIDER ORDERS FOR LIFE SUSTAINING TREATMENT FORM.

HLT, CPC/JHA

Amends the definition of "patient's provider" in state law governing Provider Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment by removing language that requires the provider to examine the patient.

HB2286 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS.

CPC, FIN

Requires fees for attorneys retained by a condominium association to be paid from the association's funds or reserves, except in matters involving the collection of delinquent assessments. Prohibits associations from assessing, demanding, or seeking reimbursement from unit owners for legal fees that are in excess of twenty-five per cent of the original debt. Requires attorneys retained by an association to confine their communications to the board, except when requesting essential information from unit owners, and refrain from billing unit owners directly. Requires attorneys retained by an association for debt collection purposes to abide by the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. Requires certain information to be included in each billing statement sent by the attorneys retained by an association. Clarifies that costs and expenses incurred by or on behalf of an association for foreclosing on a lien must be promptly paid on demand, as long as thirty days have elapsed since a notice of default and intention to foreclose has been served on a unit owner.

Appropriates funds for prefabricated, modular, or kauhale-type housing for individuals impacted by the Lahaina wildfire.

Requires the Department of Agriculture to develop tax incentives, rebates, grants, and loan programs to incentivize and provide financing for agrivoltaic farms and solar energy systems on certain agricultural land. Requires a report to the legislature.

Imposes new security requirements for voting systems. Deems as election fraud certain acts relating to the provision of valuable consideration, including gifts and loans, for the purpose of bribery; election tampering; and security breaches. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025.

CPC

Prohibits planned community associations from planting yellow oleander or causing or allowing yellow oleander to be planted on their real property. Effective 7/1/2025.

EEP, TRN, FIN Establishes the Hawaii sustainable aviation fuel program within the State Energy Office to work with the Department of Transportation and fuel suppliers in order to establish a sustainable fuel portfolio standard for the use of sustainable aviation fuels. RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT. HB2293 RELATING TO SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES. CAI, FIN Authorizes the issuance of special number plates to recognize the University of Hawaii Cancer Center. RELATING TO THE OAHU REGIONAL HEALTH CARE HB2294 HLT, CPC, FIN SYSTEM. HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION. Requires the transfer of the Maui State Veterans Home to the Oahu Regional Health Care System and then to the Department of Health, as part of the Oahu Regional Health Care System transfer pursuant to Act 212, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021. HB2295 RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE. JHA. FIN Specifies that the counties may issue traffic infractions for violations of any law prohibiting or restricting the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles on all highways and county property. Authorizes stopping, standing, and parking restrictions and prohibitions on property under jurisdiction of the Director of Transportation and the counties, respectively. HB2296 RELATING TO RENEWABLE FUEL. EEP, CPC, FIN Establishes a tax credit for the import of renewable fuel. Updates the renewable fuels production tax credit. RELATING TO GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS. EEP, CPC HB2297 Requires the Hawaii state energy office to adopt rules governing a clean fuel standard for gasoline and diesel in the State. HB2298 RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION. AGR, CPC Establishes a timeline by which roasted coffee, instant coffee, and ready-to-drink coffee beverages that use a geographic origin in labeling or advertising are required to contain a certain per cent coffee by weight from that geographic origin.

HLT, CPC, FIN HB2303 Prohibits health maintenance organizations from discriminating against certain health care providers that meet the terms and conditions for participation established by the health maintenance organization. HB2304 RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. HSG, FIN Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority for the development and construction of permanent supportive housing for certain vulnerable individuals. Requires the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to consider any available federal low-income housing tax credits needed for construction of permanent supportive housing units. HB2305 RELATING TO AIR POLLUTION. JHA Beginning 1/1/2028, prohibits the operation of leaf blowers or string trimmers that are powered using two-stroke engines. Establishes penalties to be enforced by the Department of Health.

CPC/JHA HB2316 Clarifies that, in condominium elections, cumulative voting rights apply to all candidates regardless of whether they are nominated. HB2541 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

WAL/AGR, CPC, FIN

Prohibits certain foreign parties from owning, purchasing, or acquiring an interest in agricultural lands. Establishes an Office of Agricultural Intelligence within the Department of Agriculture to investigate claims that land is unlawfully owned by a prohibited foreign party. Establishes the Hawaii Cannabis Authority and Cannabis Control FIN Board within the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to regulate all aspects of the cannabis plant. Beginning January 1, 2026, legalizes the personal adult use of cannabis. Establishes taxes for adult-use cannabis sales. Transfers the personnel and assets of the Department of Health and assets Department of Agriculture to the Hawaii Cannabis Authority. Appropriates funds.

HB2601 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY. JHA. FIN

HB2676 EDN, JHA Updates and expands the statutory prohibition on the use of tobacco at public schools to include prohibiting the possession and use of electronic smoking devices. Requires the Department of Education to be responsible for educating students, employees, and visitors about smoking and tobacco use prohibitions. HB2677 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN THE BENEFIT OF THE FIFTEENTH, SIXTEENTH, AND SEVENTEENTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS. HB2685 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes the solar hui program to allow multi-family residential property owners to invest into a solar hui investment fund to provide loans to low- and moderate-income households to install solar energy systems. Establishes the solar hui program fund manager position. Appropriates funds.

HB2686 RELATING TO THE STABILIZATION OF PROPERTY CPC, FIN INSURANCE.

Amends the laws relating to the Hawaii Hurricane Relief Fund and Hawaii Property Insurance Association. Expands the Hawaii Property Insurance Association's authority to include the issuance of property insurance other than fire insurance for certain real properties organized as a condominium. Reinstates the special mortgage recording fee. Explicitly authorizes the Hawaii Property Insurance Association to issue property insurance policies to certain condominiums outside of area designated for coverage by the Hawaii Property Insurance Association. Mandates that the Hawaii Property Insurance Association member insurers recoup assessment costs. Amends specific coverage limits, fund capitalization amounts, and assessment percentages by deleting specified dollar amounts percentages and authorizes the Hawaii Hurricane Relief Fund and the Hawaii Property Insurance Association boards to recommend appropriate amounts and percentages to the Insurance Commissioner.

HB2687 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

WAL/EEP, FIN

Establishes the resilience hub and network grant program and a special fund in the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. Increases the environmental response, energy, and food security tax and deposits a portion of the tax into the resilience hub and network grant program special fund.

HB2688 RELATING TO CARBON EMISSIONS REDUCTION.

EEP/TRN, FIN

Establishes a clean vehicle special fund to incentivize the purchase of vehicles that produce less carbon emissions by providing a rebate. Creates a gasoline-powered vehicle tax, graduated based on fuel efficiency, to be paid by purchasers of certain passenger cars and pickup trucks that are powered solely by gasoline.

HB2689 RELATING TO ZERO-EMISSION VEHICLES.

HB2692 RELATING TO THE MAUNA KEA STEWARDSHIP AND

OVERSIGHT AUTHORITY.

Authorizes 2 or more members of the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority to meet during the transition period described in section 195H-6, HRS, regarding any matter relating to the Authority's business; provided that no commitment to vote is made or sought and no decision-making action is taken. Clarifies that the Authority is subject to state sovereign

immunity.

HB2693 RELATING TO HISTORIC AND CULTURAL PRESERVATION.

WAL, JHA, FIN

Establishes the Cultural Corridor Authority to develop plans to redevelop areas affected by disaster while maintaining historic and cultural preservation. Establishes an income tax credit to incentivize the voluntary relinquishment of real property located in areas affected by disaster. Directs the Attorney General to commence eminent domain proceedings for certain purposes. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB2694 RELATING TO WATER RESOURCES.

WAL, JHA, FIN

Establishes an income tax credit to incentivize the voluntary relinquishment of private water systems. Directs the Attorney General to commence eminent domain proceedings in certain counties. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB2695 RELATING TO WATER.

WAL/JHA, FIN

Requires each county board of water supply or water board to prioritize the sustainable recharge of aquifers, ensure the health of watersheds, and, when allocating water for new development, prioritize the development of affordable housing over other types of development. Provides that these requirements shall not be construed to affect allocations of water for agricultural purposes or developments under the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended.

HB2696 RELATING TO LAHAINA WILDFIRE RECOVERY.

WAL/JHA, FIN

Establishes the Lahaina Recovery Oversight Commission within the Department of Accounting and General Services to oversee and guide the recovery of Lahaina from the 2023 wildfires. Requires the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to assist in establishing a website for the Commission. Requires annual reports. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB2698 RELATING TO REHABILITATION.

HLT, FIN

Requires the Department of Health to establish or contract with behavioral health crisis centers in each county to provide care, diagnosis, or treatment for persons experiencing a mental illness or substance use disorder crisis. Appropriates funds.

HB2699 RELATING TO THE DEFENSE OF STATE EMPLOYEES.

JHA. FIN

Requires the State to defend professionally licensed or certified state employees from civil actions when the employee was acting within the scope of their employment and was not grossly negligent or wanton, or failing to cooperate. Clarifies that the employee may employ their own attorney at the employee's own expense. Requires that if the State refuses to defend a state employee from civil actions on certain grounds, the Attorney General shall file a motion to withdraw as counsel.

HB2700 RELATING TO WILDFIRES.

HB2702 RELATING TO ROAD IMPROVEMENTS.

TRN, FIN

Appropriates funds for equipment and one full time equivalent position within the Department of Transportation to conduct improvements on Hana Highway.

HB2703 RELATING TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WAL, JHA COMMISSION ON WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT. Replaces the position of Deputy to the Chairperson of the Commission on Water Resource Management with the position of Executive Officer, who shall be appointed and managed by the Commission. Authorizes the Commission on Water Resource Management to retain independent legal counsel. Makes the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources an ex officio member of the Commission on Water Resource Management and provides that the Commission shall elect a chairperson from amongst its members. HB2706 RELATING TO FIREWORKS. JHA. FIN Establishes fines for any person who sets off fireworks without a valid permit and while a red flag warning is in effect. PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION JHA, FIN HB2707 12 OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO REQUIRE THE CHAIR OF A COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATURE TO SET FOR PUBLIC HEARING EVERY BILL ASSIGNED TO THE COMMITTEE. HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes the Hui Hoomana task force to identify actionable priorities and financial resources to offer the State's residents universal access to affordable, high-quality healthcare and health insurance. Requires reports to the Legislature. Dissolves the task force on 7/1/2025.

HB2729 RELATING TO WILDFIRE PREVENTION. WAL/EEP, FIN Appropriates funds for the University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources to establish a Central Oahu Wildfire Prevention Plan, in consultation with the Department of Land and Natural Resources, community stakeholders, and nonprofit organizations that specialize in wildfire preparedness and mitigation programming. Requires matching funds from United States Department of Agriculture Forestry Service Wildfire Defense grants. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. RELATING TO BULLYING. HB2730 EDN, FIN Requires the department of education to create and implement anti-bullying policies. Adopts, establishes, and designates the shaka as the official

gesture of the State.

HB2737 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

AGR, CPC, FIN

Amends the authorized activities and uses in agricultural districts to prohibit roadside stands from displaying and selling value-added products and establish a minimum percentage of agricultural products that must be produced on the property in order to be offered for sale at certain retail agricultural-based commercial operations.

HB2738 RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP/WAL, FIN

Requires state facilities to prepare a report assessing the feasibility of installing distributed energy resource systems at each facility. Requires state facilities to implement and install the distributed energy resource systems detailed in the reports no later than five years from the issue date of the reports. Assigns priority for the required energy efficiency measures to first responder facilities.

HB2739 RELATING TO ENERGY ASSISTANCE.

HUS/EEP, FIN

Establishes the Hawaii home energy assistance program within the Department of Human Services to assist households in paying their energy bills. Establishes the Hawaii home energy assistance special fund. Appropriates funds.

HB2740 RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, FIN

Establishes the Hawaii zero waste initiative to manage the State's

transition to a zero solid waste economy.

HB2741 RELATING TO TAXATION.

CPC, FIN

Establishes a definition for "premium cigar" that is distinct from a "large cigar" and adds a definition for "characterizing flavor" in the Cigarette Tax and Tobacco Tax Law. Excludes premium cigars from percentage excise tax. Establishes an excise tax at a rate of 50 cents per premium cigar.

HB2742 RELATING TO THE LANDLORD-TENANT CODE.

CPC, FIN

Establishes an alternative process for the termination of the rental agreement that involves mediation. Requires the Governor to notify the Chief Justice, Legislature, and Revisor of Statutes when the final wildfire proclamation will expire. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025. Appropriates funds.

HB2743 RELATING TO WASTEWATER.

EEP/WAL, FIN

Requires each county to develop and maintain a wastewater management plan. Specifies the requirements of the wastewater management plan. Authorizes the Director of Health to exempt a county from creating a wastewater management plan if the county has an existing plan that substantially meets certain requirements. Requires the counties to identify specific priority areas in which the county sewerage system or other centralized treatment system will be expanded or constructed to reduce or eliminate cesspools before 1/1/2050. Provides for the designation of these priority areas as sewer improvement districts. Authorizes each county to assess a monthly cesspool pollution fee beginning in 7/1/2025 on real properties containing a cesspool. Authorizes the counties to use fee revenues for certain activities that eliminate, reduce, or mitigate the impacts of cesspools, including the expansion of county sewerage systems and the issuance of grants and low-interest loans to property owners. HB2744 RELATING TO ORAL HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

Establishes an oral health task force to review the status of oral health in the State and make recommendations to improve the State's oral health infrastructure. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriations exceed the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

<u>HB2745</u> RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.

LMG

Short form bill relating to legislative management.

HB2746 RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

HUS, JHA, FIN

Requires and appropriate moneys for the provision of free voice communication services in the State's youth and adult correctional facilities. Amends sources of funding for and imposes a limit on moneys retained in the victim information and notification system special fund. Appropriates moneys into and out of the automated victim information and notification system special fund. Declares that the appropriations exceed the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025.

HB2747 RELATING TO CREATIVE MEDIA.

CAI, FIN

Establishes the Filmmakers Special Fund. Requires the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts to award grants for film, media, and creative industries intellectual property development projects in Hawaii. Requires consultation with the Creative Industries Division of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. Repeals 6/30/2029. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB2748 RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

TRN, JHA

Establishes statewide vehicular pursuit policies.

<u>HB2749</u> RELATING TO CHILD PROTECTION.

HUS, JHA

Amends the definition of "imminent harm" in the Child Protective Act. Clarifies the due process required for child removals, including removals by a police officer without a court order.

HB2750 RELATING TO CLEAN AND SOBER HOMES.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Requires mandatory registration for all clean and sober homes. Requires the Department of Health to ensure there is equitable distribution of clean and sober homes throughout a county. Requires an applicant to obtain written approval from the appropriate county showing compliance with all land use and zoning ordinances and rules.
