Re: Nomination to the Disability & Communication Access Board

In accordance with your request, dated February 20, 2024, I am providing the following written responses:

(1) Why do you wish to be a member of the Disability & Communication Access Board?

To perform voluntary public service, for the betterment of our community, as a contributing resident of the State of Hawaii, which I have resided my entire life.

(2) How do you perceive the role and responsibilities of a member of the Disability & Communication Access Board?

To serve as an advocate for persons with disabilities specifically in the area of facility access.

I communicate and collaborate very closely with clients, other design professionals, contractors, and government entities, to complete projects in a timely and successful manner.

I feel that my background will allow me to provide valuable feedback, and work collaboratively with other board members.

(4) What do you hope to accomplish during your term of service?

I hope to bring a knowledgeable, fair and balanced perspective to the Board in fulfilling my duties as a Board member.
