In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 568 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLAND OF HAWAI'I, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, I'INIMAIKALANI KAHAKALAU FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6/30/2027.

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 568, nominating Ms. I'inimaikalani Kahakalau to the Island Burial Council, Island of Hawaii, expiring June 30, 2027.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawai'i Revised Statutes. The Councils determine whether to preserve in place or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burials site, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advise to the Department. With the exception of the Moloka'i Island Burial Council, the island burial councils consist of no more than nine members, of which six representatives shall represent a specific geographic area, and no more than three shall be representatives of development and large landowner interests. Ms. Kahakalau is seeking to represent the Hamakua geographic area.

Ms. Kahakalau currently lives within the moku of Hamakua, and she is seeking to represent that geographic area. Ms. Kahakalau grew up in a family that speaks the Hawaiian language and practices Hawaiian traditions. She is an innovator that converges her cultural practices with place-based education in which she serves her community.

She is a graduate of Kanu O Ka 'Āina New Century Public Charter School and the University of Hawaii at Hilo. She is currently a partner in Kū-A-Kanaka LLC and a project director for Basic Hawaiian. Her responsibilities include projects on social media, creating games, and providing technical support. She also oversees the online Hawaiian language and culture program.
