In consideration of HB 1781, HD 2 RELATING TO HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Chairperson Inouye, Vice Chairperson Elefante, and members of the Committee. The Hawai'i Community Development Authority (HCDA) **supports** HB 1781, HD 2.

HB 1781 establishes the Panaewa community development district ("District") to allow for planning and development of public lands in Panaewa, Hilo, Hawai'i, by the HCDA. The bill does not include funding or staff positions—such funding or staff positions could be provided in the future.

Due to the funding horizon, we offer a suggestion related to the two proposed Panaewa community representative positions. Our suggestion will help HCDA reduce the administrative burdens of administering several boards, including the general authority board. If this bill becomes law as currently drafted, the two community representatives of the District (See, Page 8, Line 20/21 and Page 9, Lines 1 to 4) will be counted toward quorum on the general authority board despite the positions being vacant because they are **eligible voting** members. Thus, we suggest that language be added stating that the two community representatives of the District will **not** be counted towards establishing quorum of the general authority board until the date the Governor initially appoints one community representative of the District and that community



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representative is confirmed by the Senate. Accordingly, we suggest adding a new Section 3 to this bill as follows:

"Section 3. Notwithstanding Section 206E-3(g), Hawaii Revised Statutes, until the date the Governor initially appoints at least one of the community representatives of the District as set forth in Section 206E-3(b)(13), and such community representative is confirmed by the Senate, both District community representatives shall not qualify as eligible voting members as defined in Section 206E-3(g); provided, however, once the first District community representative is initially appointed and confirmed, this section shall no longer apply and both District community representatives shall qualify as eligible voting members as defined in Section 206E-3(g), regardless of whether both District community representative positions are vacant."

If the committee adopts our suggestion, we also request that the committee report be drafted to reflect this intent.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill (H.B.) No. 1781, H.D. 2, establishes the Panaewa Community

Development District (PCDD) under the Hawai'i Community Development Authority (HCDA) to allow for the planning, development, and maintenance of public lands in Panaewa, Hawai'i; establishes the Panaewa Community Development District Special Fund (PCDDSF) for HCDA to administrate and operate the PCDD; and amends the membership of the HCDA to include representatives for the PCDD. The PCDDSF would generate revenue from the PCDD, legislative appropriations, and by collecting other funds from government agencies and private individuals or organizations.

As a matter of general policy, B&F does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work, and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and

charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. Regarding H.B. No. 1781, H.D. 2, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed special fund would be self-sustaining.
