1	Fiscal Implications: This measure may impact the priorities identified in the Governor's
2	Executive Budget Request for the Department of Health's (Department) appropriations and
3	personnel priorities.
4	Department Testimony: The Department supports this measure that seeks to fund long-term air
5	and water monitoring in areas impacted by the 2023 Maui wildfires. The type and amount of
6	long-term monitoring, which is generally assumed to be post-cleanup/disposal, has not been
7	determined and we offer the following for discussion.
8	In Kula, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has completed their debris removal
9	work and the Department will be removing most of the air quality monitors in this area.
10	PurpleAir sensors that continuously test for fine particulate matter and are used as an indicator of
11	the levels of other pollutants of concern that attach to ash and dust, will remain at upcountry
12	schools. These same types of sensors have been placed around the temporary disposal site in
13	Olowalu, which is not mentioned in the bill.
14	Currently, in the area of the Lahaina cleanup, the Department operates close to
15	50 PurpleAir sensors and 6 Environmental Beta Attenuation Mass monitors (E-BAMs), the latter
16	being near regulatory instruments and providing increased accuracy in particulate monitoring. In
17	addition, 4 sampling stations, funded through the Department/Hawaii Emergency Management
18	Agency, test for asbestos and heavy metals. It is our understanding that the USACE debris
19	removal work is anticipated to last for approximately 1 year.

The need for long-term monitoring (beyond a year), may be dependent on the debris

removal extending beyond the anticipated year and on evaluation of the data taken during the

- 1 cleanup and disposal activities. In Kula, the levels for asbestos were non-detect, the metal levels
- 2 were low and all below the levels where impacts to human health are expected, and the
- 3 particulates were elevated at times, but mainly attributed to activities such as wood chipping of
- 4 fallen trees.
- 5 If additional monitoring is determined to be beneficial at any of the locations, the Department
- 6 already has a sizeable quantity of PurpleAir sensors. However, the Department does not have
- 7 additional E-BAMs to deploy. Each unit costs approximately \$20,000, not including the costs
- 8 for operation and maintenance. If additional air sampling is determined to be beneficial,
- 9 additional funding would be needed, as the 4 Lahaina sampling stations were contracted for
- 10 1 year of operation at over \$4 million.
- The bill also proposes to fund an Air Quality Electronics Technician (AQET) I for the State
- 12 fiscal year. We request that the AQET position be changed to an Environmental Health
- 13 Specialist (EHS) and that the position be made permanent. An EHS can assist with duties to set
- up and maintain air quality monitoring equipment, which is the primary responsibility of an
- 15 AQET, but can also perform other tasks such as review and validate data and investigate and
- 16 assess any spikes or unusual occurrences in the air quality being monitored.
- 17 Indications are that recent events such as wildfires, including those that occurred in Lahaina,
- 18 Kula, Olinda, and Mililani, will increase as climate change impacts weather patterns and adds to
- 19 the demand on Department monitoring and response resources. Moreover, other natural events,
- 20 including volcanic eruptions, can also occur, requiring additional air monitoring to assess air
- 21 quality and protect public health. The United States Geological Survey reports that Kilauea has
- 22 experienced an increase in seismic activity and that an eruption could occur with little warning
- 23 which would further increase the workload on current Department staff. During unpredicted
- events such as these, staff are taken away from their regular duties and the program must catch
- 25 up later or risk falling into noncompliance with federal regulations.
- The Department also seeks clarification on the long term monitoring for water quality. Is it
- 27 the intent of the Legislators for water quality monitoring to include drinking and near shore
- water?
