<u>**DEPARTMENT'S POSITION**</u>: The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports this measure, defers to the Department of Education, and provides comments.

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this bill is to appropriate funds for four full-time equivalent career foundations certificate program teachers at McKinley Community School for Adults.

The Committee on Education amended the measure by:

- (1) Changing the appropriation to an unspecified amount; and
- (2) Changing the effective date to July 1, 3000.

The DHS Division of Vocational Rehabilitation is an integral member of the Workforce Development Council and a Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) partner and supports this measure to help sustain the McKinley Community School for Adults' Workforce Development Program (Act 261, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022).

The Workforce Development Program provides workforce preparation for adult education students, adults with disabilities, and high school students. This preparation includes opportunities to earn associate degrees, workforce development diplomas, and other

certificates to ensure they develop the skills and credentials needed to make them highly employable. DHS agrees that providing funding for four full-time equivalent teachers will further the success of the program and provide a much-needed service to the individuals served, as well as to employers in the State of Hawaii.

The Hawai'i State Teachers Association **supports** HB2242 HD1 which appropriates funds for four full-time equivalent career foundations certificate program teachers for McKinley Community School for Adults.

Act 261 (2022) was the right first step to establish the workforce readiness program at MCSA. The job needs to be finished, now, by allowing MCSA to properly staff those positions as we work towards generating highly employable graduates who will be contributing members of society.
