The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) appreciates the opportunity to provide testimony on HB 2280. Although the Department is open to measures that facilitate enhanced access to education, the efficacy of HB 2280 in addressing the current school transportation shortage is uncertain.

The utilization of smaller motorcoaches, buses, and vans owned by the Department's contractors – the operation of which does not require drivers to hold a commercial driver's license – is already being prioritized, albeit for special education transportation. Federally-mandated special education transportation remains the Department's highest priority. The prioritized allocation of these vehicles to fulfill the federal special education mandate does not allow for a sufficient number of vehicles to be utilized in regular education transportation.

For the foregoing reasons, the Department provides comments on HB 2280, and thanks the Committee for the opportunity to provide testimony.
