Chair Yamashita and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General provides the following comments.

This bill, titled "Relating to the Hawaiian Language College Revolving Fund and the Hawaiian Early Learning Trust Fund": (1) amends section 304A-2270, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to authorize the Hawaiian Language College Revolving Fund to accept revenue from any source, including training and personal development, evaluation services, sale of products, translation services, and consultation; and to indicate that the revenue deposited into the Hawaiian Language College Revolving Fund may not be limited by the University of Hawai'i, provided that the total of any individual deposit shall not exceed \$499,999.00; and (2) amends section 304A-2356, HRS, to authorize the University of Hawai'i at Hilo to expend moneys from the Hawaiian Early Learning Trust Fund for purposes of the Hawaiian language medium education pathway, including support for the University of Hawai'i at Hilo's Imiloa Center and the Hawaiian Language College; and to indicate that the revenue deposited into the Hawaiian Early Learning Trust Fund shall not be limited by the University of Hawai'i, provided that the total of any individual deposit shall not exceed \$499,999.00.

Article III, section 14, of the Hawai'i Constitution, provides in pertinent part that "[e]ach law shall embrace but one subject, which shall be expressed in its title." As indicated in the bill's title and in the bill's content, this bill embraces two separate

subjects, the (1) the Hawaiian Language College Revolving Fund, established by section 304A-2270, HRS, and (2) the Hawaiian Early Learning Trust Fund, established by section 304A-2356, HRS. Consequently, this bill is subject to a challenge of violating the single subject requirement and being constitutionally invalid. The Department recommends that this bill be held.

My name is Dr. Kēhaulani 'Aipia-Peters, and I am the Governing Board Chair of Ke Kula 'O Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u Iki, Laboratory Public Charter School. I am providing written testimony in STRONG SUPPORT of HB 2682.

We, the governing board of Nāwahī, **STRONGLY SUPPORT** HB 2682 that provides that the Hawaiian language college revolving fund may include moneys from any revenue source. This bill also provides that the fund and the Hawaiian early learning trust fund shall support the 'Imiloa Astronomy Center, and establishes a cap on individual deposits into the Hawaiian language college revolving fund and the Hawaiian early learning trust fund.

Ke Kula 'O Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u is a laboratory school program of Ka Haka 'Ula o Ke'elikōlani, the Hawaiian Language college at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. These proposed changes to the Hawaiian language college revolving fund ensure the continuance of our progress in Hawaiian Medium education and language revitalization. These changes also address the need for strategic support to address the distinctiveness of Hawaiian language medium education and its continued progress from early learning through post-secondary education.

The passage of HB 2682 indicates an awareness of the significance of the Hawaiian language college at the University of Hawaii at Hilo as they address the needs of and ensure the forward progress of Hawaiian language medium education.

Aloha Chair Yamashita and Vice Chair Kitagawa of the House Finance Committee.

My name is Dr. William H. Wilson. I am a long time faculty member of the Hawaiian program here in Hilo, being the first person tenured in this area at UH Hilo. Over the years I have seen the program grow here from a very modest set of courses to the present status of having a full college with a B.A. through to the Ph.D., teacher certification, a laboratory school, a high functioning curriculum development program, an on-line resource center and a close working relationship with the 'Imiloa Center a combined museum and community outreach and resource center operated in conjunction with our college. We have expanded to serve other indigenous communities, especially those of the US this past fall being awarded by the US Department of Education with leadership of the first National Native American Language Resource Center.

All of our efforts have been built upon strong leadership from the state legislature that has passed legislation to make the above progress possible through designating our work as an area of special state concern. The status granted us by the legislature has provided us a means to bring in outside funding to Hawai'i.

HB 2682 further strengthens our ability to bring in external funding to Hawai'i and use that funding to support the areas of statewide concern for which the legislature has mandated the establishment of the various Hawaiian programs of our College and 'Imiloa. It will also allow us to work more efficiently and therefore bring in more funding from tribes, states and foundations that seek to work with us under our leadership in the revitalization and strengthening of Indigenous languages and cultures.

Hb2682 seeks no funds from the legislature, but instead seeks legislatiive support to bring in funds for Hawai'i, serving the economic interests of the state as a whole.

I strongly urge passage of this HB 2682, or inclusion of its purposes in other legislation, as has been the practice of the legislature in supporting our work here in Hilo in the past.
