- 2. Shipping firm Young Brothers Hawaii has experienced arrival delays at Kaumālapa'u Harbor, Lāna'i's primary commercial harbor, because of poor weather, unfavorable ocean conditions, and other factors.
- 3. Improving barge services is essential for economic development. The delivery of food and other essential goods provides a lifeline to Lāna'i's grocery stores and local businesses.
