In Hawaii, the groundwater system delivers freshwater to everyone's homes. It is charged by the native plants in the mountains. The native plants that were burned by the wildfires could easily be replaced by fast-growing invasive plants. These plants will not contribute to recharging the groundwater supply like the native plants do. So, replanting native plants and weeding out the invasive plants will help make sure there is enough freshwater for our daily use and for future generations.

I hope you will consider passing HR9/HCR19 because I believe it will benefit our community in the present and the future.
