



Multi-hazard projects utilizing nature-based solutions and emerging technologies





### **Governor's Hazard Mitigation Funding Priorities for DR-4724**







Revamp HHARP 2.0









HHARP is a program designed by the State of Hawaii to improve disaster resilience at the community level. Supported by subject-matter experts, communities complete a six-module program that promotes:

- + Awareness of Hawaii's hazards
- + Personal and family preparedness (build a kit, make a plan, protect property)
- + Understanding of risk and vulnerability
- Identification of coping capacities and resources
- Self-reliance in the immediate aftermath of a disaster
