Honorable Chair Wakai, Vice-Chair Elefante, and Members of the Committees on Public Safety and Intergovernmental and Military Affairs. The County of Hawai'i, Office of the Prosecuting Attorney submits the following testimony in support of Senate Bill No. 2307.

This bill was drafted with the intention to allow the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (DCR) in collaboration with various agencies to assist inmates in obtaining civil identification cards, birth certificates, social security cards, and other relevant identification necessary for reintegration into the workforce, access social services, verify applicable medicaid eligibility, and secure housing.

We recognize that individuals transitioning from incarceration encounter obstacles while trying to obtain necessary identification documents. Inability to obtain identification documents is often times referenced as a contributing factor to recidivism. This measure encourages the positive reintegration of justice-involved individuals by helping them access these needed services at the most crucial time, prior to release from incarceration and reentry into our community.

For the foregoing reasons, the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Hawai'i, supports Senate Bill No. 2307. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.
