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Testimony in SUPPORT of SB 2467 RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE HOSPITAL

- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Health ("Department") supports this measure and
- 2 requests it be considered as a vehicle to enhance security at the Hawaii State Hospital provided
- 3 it does not supplant the requests outlined in the Governor's executive budget request.
- 4 **Department Position:** The Department supports this measure and offers comments.
- 5 **Department Testimony:** The Adult Mental Health Division (AMHD) provides the following
- 6 testimony on behalf of the Department.

7 The Department supports this measure which appropriates funds for safety and quality 8 improvements at the Hawaii State Hospital (HSH) in the aftermath of the tragic incident at an 9 outpatient group home on the hospital campus. The recommended improvements are a result 10 of the comprehensive safety review that was conducted. The quality improvements will help 11 bolster the safety of the hospital's staff, patients, and visitors. Such improvements include 12 security-related enhancements to the physical plant, upgrades to the camera surveillance and 13 overhead PA systems, and the reinforcement of control over entrance and exit points.

Leadership organizational changes including the addition of an associate administrator for safety and security and a Security Director are urgently needed. Also, the creation of a safety team to work in conjunction with contracted security contractors to enact improved safety
 procedures is planned.

The burgeoning hospital census has created overcrowded conditions at the HSH.
Repurposing of treatment areas into patient dorms is an ongoing process. These converted
areas require additional staff.

6 The hospital is grappling with another significant challenge, namely, the shortage of beds in 7 supervised group homes and residential substance abuse facilities throughout the state. The 8 HSH is just one point in a serious mental illness (SMI) treatment continuum. For the HSH to discharge a patient, there must be a designated destination; discharging patients to the streets 9 10 is not permitted. Most, if not all, patients discharged from the HSH require ongoing intensive 11 supervision and care. The most common placements are supervised group homes and residential substance use disorder programs. These beds are in short supply. Increasing the 12 capacity of supervised group home beds and updating contracted rates is imperative before the 13 HSH can effectively alleviate the current issue of overcrowding. 14

Additionally, patient transition also heavily relies on timely and accurate evaluations by court appointed examiners. Many patients remain at the HSH because there are not sufficient examiners to complete evaluations. Additional positions and increased recruitment and retention efforts will help alleviate the backlog.

Offered Amendments: The Department respectfully offers the following amendments to
 section 3 of the bill:

Purchase equipment (\$920,000)
installation of new cameras;
integrate and upgrade the PA system;
metal detector wands;
urinalysis testing and supplies
reinforce control of entry and exit points (\$700,000)

- increase staffing: 14 positions (\$2,745,000) and pay increases for existing forensic psychologists and;
- support the mental health continuum of care (\$10,000,000).

- 5 Pay adjustments for existing group homes;
- 6 2 new 24-hour group homes;

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- 2 new LCRS group homes and;
- 8 Enhanced contracted security for the HSH campus
