SENATE BILL 2526 SD2 HD1 RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Dear Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and members of the committee:

The Office of Enterprise Technology Services (ETS) **supports** this bill to extend the Technology Services Consolidation Working Group through June 30, 2026, as it assists ETS in working with certain state agencies to inventory and categorize the business criticality of each major state information technology system or data set and determine the appropriate data center or hosting facility requirements.

SB 2526 SD2 HD1 amends Act 179 (2022) to allow ETS to partner with private providers and carriers; to inventory and categorize the business criticality of each major state information technology systems or data set; determine the appropriate data center or hosting facility requirements based on the business criticality level of the system or data set; and ensure that all consolidated state information technology data be housed in a facility with the resiliency to perform maintenance without downtime, as well as having contingencies for power outages and other emergencies.

The working group will submit a preliminary status report of its findings and recommendations to the legislature prior to the 2025 session, and a report prior to the 2026 session.

Inclusion in this bill would be duplicative and create added costs for both ETS and HHSC as HHSC is already in the process of fortifying its HHSC data center.
