Chair Aquino and Members of the Committee:

My name is Gordon I. Ito, and I am the Insurance Commissioner of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' (Department) Insurance Division. The Department offers comments on this bill.


The purpose of this bill is to require that the charges for chiropractic treatments for personal injury protection benefits under motor vehicle insurance be tied to the charges, and any subsequent increases in charges, permissible under the workers' compensation supplemental medical fee schedule.

Section 2 of this bill amends Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 431:10C-103.6(b) by replacing current provisions for chiropractic care under motor vehicle insurance with a standard of "not more than [t]hirty visits", with the charge per visit "tied to the charges, and any subsequent increases in charges, permissible under the workers' compensation supplemental medical fee schedule[,]" rather than the current standard of no more than \$75 per visit.

The existing law ensures that consumers injured in automobile accidents can seek a variety of treatments to aid in recovery from injuries.

Finally, this bill may lead to increased motor vehicle insurance premium rates. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

SB 2673

Chair Aquino, Vice Chair Moriwaki, and members of the Committee on Labor and Technology, my name is Alison Ueoka, President for Hawaii Insurers Council. The Hawaii Insurers Council is a non-profit trade association of property and casualty insurance companies licensed to do business in Hawaii. Member companies underwrite approximately forty percent of all property and casualty insurance premiums in the state.

Hawaii Insurers Council submits **comments** on this bill. SB 2673 increases the chiropractic reimbursement rate under motor vehicle insurance from \$75 per visit to that of the workers' compensation medical fee schedule. Since the workers' compensation medical fee schedule rate is not a static number and can be manipulated by using a variety of modalities and CPT codes, the per-visit charge may increase dramatically. This, in turn, will increase the cost of motor vehicle insurance premiums. The increase in premiums will come in a hard market which means motor vehicle insurance premiums are already going up, mostly by double digits and are expected to continue on this trend for a few years. Higher motor insurance premiums may result in a higher number of uninsured motorists and is regressive, penalizing those who can least afford it.

Aloha Chair Aquino, Vice Chair Moriwaki and Members of the Committee:

APCIA has concerns about SB 2673 which could increase the cost of motor vehicle insurance by increasing the fees paid to chiropractors. The American Property Casualty Insurance Association (APCIA) is the primary national trade association for home, auto, and business insurers. APCIA promotes and protects the viability of private competition for the benefit of consumers and insurers, with a legacy dating back 150 years. APCIA members represent all sizes, structures, and regions—protecting families, communities, and businesses in the U.S. and across the globe.

SB 2673 changes the chiropractic reimbursement rate under motor vehicle insurance from \$75 per visit to that of the workers' compensation medical fee schedule. The intent language correctly points out this was a key reform of the 1997 reforms which helped to reduce auto insurance premiums in Hawaii. This bill would eliminate the predictability of the existing law and tie the reimbursement rate to the workers' compensation medical fee schedule rate which is not a static number and can be manipulated by using a variety of modalities and CPT codes, the per-visit charge may increase dramatically. This, in turn, will increase the cost of motor vehicle insurance premiums. The increase in premiums will come in a hard market which means motor vehicle insurance premiums are already going up, mostly by double digits and are expected to continue on this trend for a few years. Higher motor insurance premiums may result in a higher number of uninsured motorists and is regressive, penalizing those who can least afford it.

For these reasons, APCIA asks the committee to HOLD this bill in committee.

As a dual licensed Chiropractor and Naturopathic Physician, I support this bill. I run a small business which is an outpatient clinic in Hilo, on the Big Island.

Chiropractors and Naturopathic Physicians are often the first healthcare provider types that patients see after sustaining an injury as the result of a motor vehicle accident. As primary care providers, these doctors should be reimbursed for all medically necessary care and should be able to make referrals for additional care as needed.

Aligning the reimbursement for care after motor vehicle accidents with the fee schedule for workman's compensation type cases will help to modernize the structure so that we may provide excellent care to our patients while still staying in business. This improvement would also help to tackle rising healthcare costs as many patients currently have to seek additional provider types because under the existing statute reimbursement for additional services beyond the current limit is not available from their chiropractic or naturopathic provider.

I am writing in support of this bill. Reimbursement rates for auto personal injury cases have been fixed at \$75 for almost 30 years. We are long overdue for an increase.

We are not asking for a blank check but a reimbursement rate fixed to the worker's compensation fee schedule which is set by the state of Hawaii.

Hawaii has a shortage of doctors. While there are many more licensed chiropractors in Hawaii only 69 can be found on Google on the island of Oahu. I can speak personally that a very small percentage of our patient base is coming from car accidents. Add to this the cost of seeing a chiropractor after a motor vehicle accident is far less expensive then other healthcare professions the added cost to the car insurance consumer is minimal.
