Purpose of Bill: Requires each public employer to pay for the employer's

Department's Position:

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) provides comments regarding SB 2897. The Department appreciates efforts to support the recruitment and retention of professional employees statewide by reducing barriers for professions that require a professional license.

If the bill passes, the Department will request that funding and staffing appropriations be included in the bill. Currently, the Department does not have staff dedicated to tracking, reimbursing, or collecting professional licensing fees.

As an alternative, the Department recommends all fees be waived or paid by the appropriate licensing agency rather than by the employer.

As the state's largest public sector union, we represent many of the professionally licensed employees impacted by the passage of this measure. Unfortunately, many employers choose to not pay for their employee's renewal fees, which has caused financial hardships for many public employees. By requiring each public employer to pay for necessary license renewal fees, it will appropriately shift the cost burden from the employee to the employer. It will also enable each public employer to attract and retain qualified employees to provide services that are essential to the public.

Although we appreciate the Legislative intent of this bill, we came to an agreement in the 2023 Legislative Session with the State Department of Human Resources and Development that Professional License Fees are a negotiable item and subject to collective bargaining. Therefore, we look forward to the possibility of perusing this item when our HGEA contracts open in 2025.
