Title of Bill: HB 0658 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

Purpose of Bill: Allows students who experienced educational disruption to

graduate high school through enrollment in an accepted alternative education program and participation in certain

activities approved by the department of education.

Department's Position:

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) offers comments on HB 658. The bill strives to provide differentiated opportunities for students in vulnerable populations to successfully complete high school despite educational disruption and barriers caused by unstable housing or other similar circumstances. The Department appreciates the Legislature's support in exploring pathways to graduation for students who experience educational disruption.

Prior to any proposed statutory amendments to Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Department requests a working group be convened for the purposes of analyzing data associated with students who are experiencing educational disruption, identifying and exploring existing pathways for students on non-traditional pathways toward graduation, soliciting input and feedback of relevant subject-matter experts and assessing the capacity within and outside the Department. Finally, the outcomes and proposals generated by this working group should be provided to the Hawaii State Board of Education, a critical stakeholder in this conversation.
