We will teach canoe carving, Ko'i (Hawaiian adze) making, and filmmaking to our target population of Native Hawaiian Veterans. We will also recruit Native Hawaiians, Veterans, Active Military, First Responder, and also, we will not turn anyone away who wants to participate. We will be working with Veteran organizations to provide referral, potential counseling sessions, and letting participants know of support services and benefits available to them. We will do weekly workshops where we will carve a canoe, from harvest of a tree to launch in the ocean. We will make Ko'i which will be used for the finish carving. And we will film this project with professional filmmakers who will teach participants the basics of filmmaking, and then have a finished film documenting this project.

Our main goal is to provide a space for participants to advocate for and support each other. To engage with the participants towards a common goal. A goal which perpetuates fading cultural practices of canoe carving and Ko'i making.

II. Background and Summary

1. Brief description of applicant's background- Hua o Lahui was formally organized in 2019, after doing projects since ~2015. We have organized canoe carving demonstrations and all the logistics that go along with such projects. We have recently got into filmmaking, documenting the canoe carving process.

2. The goal of this project is to provide a space to improve the health, well-being, and quality of life for Native Hawaiian Veterans through the cultural practice of canoe carving and Ko'i making. We want the participants to be the advocates for programs and benefits that are available to Veterans. We will also partner with Veteran organizations to be able to offer their programs to our participants. In addition participants will gain skill/experience working with power tools, appreciation of ancient tools, filmmaking skills, while perpetuating these fading cultural practices.

3. The public purpose and need to be served is to improve the lives of the participants (with an emphasis on Native Hawaiian Veterans), perpetuating the traditional cultural practice of canoe carving and Ko'i making, and documenting these crafts.

4. The target population is Native Hawaiian Veterans, but our program will be open to all. We will also recruit Native Hawaiians, First Responders, Active Military.

5. This project will take place in Keaukaha, Hawai'i Island.

III. Service Summary and Outcomes

1. Scope of work, tasks and responsibilities- 1. We will carve a canoe from harvest of tree to completed canoe. We will use modern tools to rough carve the canoe, then use the Ko'i as part of the finish carve. 2. We will make a Ko'i, from harvesting Hau bark to make the cordage, gathering basalt rock from Mauna Kea Adze Quarry, and harvesting Hau wood to make the handle of the Ko'i. 3. We will contract local filmmakers to document the process of Ko'i making, and also the canoe carving. 4. We will use Hawaiian protocols for the gathering of materials and starting each workday.

2. This project will consist of once-a-week workshops for 1-year, 52 workshops, drop-in style, providing lunch for the participants. The following is a projected 1-year timeline: 7/8/25- *Tree will be harvested, transported to site. Filming.*

7/15/25- Log will be staged for carving, to dry out for 11 weeks. Filming.

7/22/25- Start on adze. Harvest Hau bark and soak in water for 1 week. Filming.

7/29/25- Clean and dry Hau bark for cordage. Filming.

8/5/25- Mauna Kea adze quarry to select rocks. Filming.

8/12/25- Harvest Hau wood for adze handle, dry for 2 weeks. Filming.

8/19/25- Start to shape basalt rock. Make cordage. Filming.

8/26/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle.

9/2/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle.

9/9/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle.

9/16/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle.

9/23/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle.

9/30/25- Shape basalt rock, make cordage, shape Hau wood for handle. Assemble adze. Filming.

10/7/25- Carve canoe. Make first cuts into log. Filming.

10/14/25- Take measurements and draw out shape. Filming.

The measures that will be used in a 5-point scale questionnaire will be: Expectations- did we fall short or exceed; Quality of life- decline or improve; Sense of belonging- low or high; Level of skill with tools- decline or improve; Knowledge of canoe carving- decrease or increase; Knowledge of Ko'i makingdecrease or increase; Knowledge of Hawaiian protocols- decrease or increase; Would you recommend this program to others in general- yes or no; Would you participate in this program again- yes or no.

V. Experience and Capability

1. Necessary Skills and Experience

Although Hua o Lahui only formally organized in 2019, we were doing canoe carving projects for several years prior. Prior to 2020 (pre-covid), we either carved or were part of the carve team on five canoes. We shut down for three years during covid, and started carving again in 2023, but nothing formal. We are currently working on two canoes, and inherited an unfinished canoe that we will start working on.

2. Facilities

We've carved at the homes of our carvers. One demonstration was done at Hilo Bayfront. Another Demonstration was done across of Hilo Civic. In 2020 we had organized three demonstration for Merrie Monarch (Hilo), FestPac (Honolulu), IVF World Sprints (Hilo), but everything go shutdown due to covid.

For this carve we have secured the use of Onekahakaha in Hilo. The caretaker of Onekahakaha is partially disabled and uses a wheelchair. So, this site is wheelchair accessible with bathrooms. We will be providing our own 20ft. container for storage, tents, tables, and chairs.

For this project we will have three experienced canoe carvers, supervising and carving with the participants.


- 1. Zak Shimose- Carving canoes since 2015. Apprenticed under master Hawaiian canoe carver, Ray Bumatay, from 2017-2020, when Ray passed away.
- 2. Eric Kai- Carving canoes with Zak since 2016.
- 3. Kapai Paaluhi- Carving canoes with Zak since 2016.

Zak has provided administrative direction for this project, as he has done with past carving projects which have included:

- Strategizing and planning events/carves
- Fundraising, grant writing
- Securing locations and necessary amenities
- Securing housing, travel, food
- Securing trees, tools, materials, supplies for carving

For our Ko'i maker, we have been talking with master Ko'i maker Tom Pico. Tom has been making Ko'i for 25+ years. Tom has said he would help out and provide guidance with our project, but has not been able to commit. Zak is confident that even if Tom Pico is unable to commit, we will be able to make Ko'i, as Zak has made Hau cordage, and would only need the basalt stone and Hau wood.
