

No part of the requested State GIA funds will be used for renovations related to church services and/or religious programs but will be dedicated to preserving and restoring the historic structure and its architectural elements.

### **II. Background and Summary**

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Makiki Christian Church, founded in 1904 by Reverend Takie Okumura, has deep roots in Honolulu's Japanese immigrant community. Established during a period when thousands of Japanese workers were arriving in Hawaii to labor on sugar plantations, the church initially provided spiritual and social support to this growing population. Reverend Okumura, a visionary missionary, emphasized education, cultural integration, and faith, creating a space where immigrants could navigate the challenges of a new land. By 1918, the church began offering English-language services to meet the needs of second- and third-generation congregants, reflecting its commitment to serving a multicultural and evolving community.

The church's iconic building, constructed in 1932, was designed by architect Hego Fuchino to resemble a 16th-century Japanese castle, specifically Kochi Castle from Reverend Okumura's hometown. This architectural choice not only honors Japanese heritage but also symbolizes peace, protection, and refuge, aligning with the church's mission. Today, the building is recognized on the Hawaii Register of Historic Places, serving as a historical and cultural landmark in Hawaii. Its distinctive design highlights the blending of Japanese traditions with the local Hawaiian context, representing the fusion of cultures that defines the islands' history.

Over the years, Makiki Christian Church has become a cornerstone of its community, offering programs that reflect its mission to be a Spirit-led and inclusive congregation. These include the Makiki Christian Church Preschool, established in 1965 to support local families, and the Senior Ministry, which fosters fellowship and care for older adults. Accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the preschool serves children aged 2 to 5 years old, offering a nurturing and educational environment that focuses on spiritual, intellectual, social, physical, and emotional development.

Community partnerships include River of Life Mission to support the needs of Hawaii's growing homeless population; Waikiki Health; Meals for Next Step/Keauhou Shelters; and Monthly videoconferencing to connect incarcerated parents with children and family members. Makiki Christian Church also serves as the site for Ala Moana-Kakaako Neighborhood Board and town hall meetings for legislators and city council members. The church also operates a thrift shop to serve the community's practical needs while promoting stewardship and generosity. Through its historical significance, architectural legacy, and enduring community outreach, Makiki Christian Church continues to embody the multicultural spirit of Hawaii.

## 2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

### **Goal**

To preserve the structural integrity of Makiki Christian Church, a historical landmark, so this cultural icon can continue to serve as the hub for critical programs and support to those in need for generations – from keiki to kupuna.

## Objectives

1. Makiki Christian Church will work with a qualified and licensed contractor to undertake emergency repairs to this historic building, including re-roofing of the tower and social hall to ensure structural stability.
2. The emergency repairs will restore Makiki Christian Church's infrastructure to provide a safe and functional space for community-based programs that serve children, families, seniors and the members of the community.
3. The public purpose and need to be served:

For more than a century, Makiki Christian Church has served as a beacon of hope, offering a reliable and supportive space, particularly during times of crisis. Constructed in 1932, the five-story redwood structure is an architectural marvel, modeled after an early Edo period Japanese castle. It stands as the only Christian church in the United States designed in this unique style. Listed on the Hawaii Register of Historic Places, the ninety-foot tower and the distinct Eastern-inspired rooflines have made it a landmark in our community, blending Eastern motifs with Western materials to create something truly extraordinary.

The church is now in dire need of urgent repairs to preserve this historic structure, which has stood proudly for nearly a century, ensuring it is not lost to future generations. The emergency roof repairs and renovations to this historic and landmark facility are essential for preserving the structural integrity of a community cornerstone that has long served as a safe and welcoming space for residents of all ages. As a place that provides vital programs and support for those in need, the church's physical condition directly impacts its ability to continue offering these services. The roof repairs are necessary to protect the building from further damage, ensuring that the church can remain a functional venue for community gatherings, outreach programs, and essential social services that benefit individuals and families throughout the area.

By addressing this critical infrastructure need, Makiki Christian Church will be able to sustain and expand its partnerships with local organizations, ensuring that programs such as its preschool, senior services, food assistance, and emergency relief can continue without disruption. These repairs will provide a safe environment for both young and old members of the community, allowing the church to remain a hub for intergenerational support.

4. Describe the target population to be served:

Makiki Christian Church serves keiki to kupuna from diverse cultural, generational, and socioeconomic backgrounds. Since its establishment more than 100 years ago, Makiki Christian Church caters to families, young children and older adults through its programs and services. By offering bilingual worship services and fostering an inclusive, Spirit-led community, the church appeals to a wide audience while honoring its historical roots within Hawaii's Japanese-American community.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

Located in the heart of Makiki, Makiki Christian Church primarily serves the urban core of Honolulu and contiguous communities. However, its geographic coverage extends to the broader Honolulu community, attracting individuals and families of all ages from nearby neighborhoods such as Manoa, Kaka'ako, and Ala Moana, to communities as distant as Mililani and Kailua. While its immediate focus is on the local population within the city, the church's programs and services, such as its preschool, senior ministry, and community outreach efforts, are open to individuals and families from across the island. Additionally, its historical significance and unique architecture draw many visitors from beyond Oahu, including tourists and those interested in Hawaii's cultural and religious history.

### **III. Service Summary and Outcomes**

Grant-in-aid funds would be used toward the cost of emergency repairs to Makiki Christian Church, including re-roofing of the social hall and all related costs. No part of the requested State GIA funds will be used for renovations related to church services and/or religious programs but will be dedicated to preserving and restoring the historic structure and its architectural elements. If awarded funding, Makiki Christian Church staff will accomplish the following tasks:

- 1) Send out bids for a qualified contractor(s).
- 2) Finalize signed contract with a contractor(s) for emergency repairs.
- 3) Begin urgent repairs, including re-roofing of the tower and social hall.
- 4) Punch Out and Close Out completed for renovations and upgrades.

Throughout duration of the repairs, the contractor will oversee periodic job inspections and supervise the punch list and project closeout to ensure the project remains on time and within budget.

2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service;

Upon receiving the Notice to Proceed, Makiki Christian Church will immediately draw down on funds to support this shovel-ready capital project, fully expending grant funds within a 12-month period.

Makiki Christian Church will work with the contractor(s) to develop key milestones for this capital project to ensure the emergency repairs are completed on time and within budget.

Makiki Christian Church is well-qualified to undertake a capital project due to its long-standing history, established leadership, and experience in managing community-focused initiatives. With over a century of service, the church has developed a strong foundation in both spiritual leadership and community outreach. Its Senior Pastor, Reverend Wayne Ibara, has been at the helm since 1995, bringing stability and direction to the congregation. The church's experience with managing programs such as the Makiki Christian Church Preschool and its historic status, recognized on the Hawaii Register of Historic Places, demonstrates its capacity to undertake significant projects while honoring its architectural heritage. Additionally, its established network of community support and resources further enhances its ability to successfully complete capital endeavors.

### **2. Facilities**

Constructed in 1932, Makiki Christian Church features a five-story redwood building, with the main tower rising ninety feet above street level. Built four years later, a two-story parish hall extends from the tower, giving the building a T-shaped floor plan. The church's facilities include a sanctuary, parish hall, Christian education building, and administrative offices. The Makiki Christian Church Preschool is located within the education building at 829 Pensacola Street.

Since accepting the call to Makiki Christian Church in 1995, Reverend Ibara has been actively involved in various positions within the Oahu Association and Hawaii Conference, contributing significantly to the spiritual growth and community engagement of the church.
