The Marimed Foundation for Island Health Care Training (Marimed), established in 1984, is dedicated to providing innovative education, training, and therapy programs throughout the Pacific region. Since 1990, Marimed has focused on supporting at-risk youth through initiatives funded by over 21 competitive contracts with national and state agencies, foundations, and private donors. Key funders include the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), U.S. Department of Education, U.S. Department of Labor, and the State of Hawai'i Department of Education, and Oahu First Circuit Court.

Recent support for Marimed's maritime training programs has been provided the grant funds from the U.S. Department of Education's Native Hawai'i an Career and Technical Education Program (NHCTEP), the Harry & Jeanette Weinberg Foundation, and the

Harold KL Castle Foundation. These funds have enabled us to train over 500 students for successful careers in the maritime industry over the past 12 years.

Marimed is a member of the Association for Experiential Education and belongs to organizations such as Tall Ships America and Association for Career & Technical Education. Its research contributions have been featured in prestigious academic journals.

Marimed operates a Coast Guard-certified Sailing School Vessel, maintaining an impeccable safety record, and its highly experienced staff holds the necessary federal and state certifications. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, Marimed adheres to rigorous federal standards, ethical practices, and Better Business guidelines. With 50 years of combined maritime expertise and experience working with youth and adults, the Marimed team is passionately committed to empowering individuals from diverse backgrounds through transformative ocean-based programs.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

The primary goal of this grant request is to inspire and prepare middle and high school students in the State of Hawai'i for maritime career pathways through immersive, hands-on educational experiences aboard the SSV *Makani Olu*. These day sails are designed to provide students with foundational maritime skills, foster a deeper appreciation for the ocean, and introduce them to the many career opportunities within the maritime industry.

As a Hawai'i 's only Coast Guard-certified Sailing School Vessel (SSV), the *Makani Olu* offers a unique learning environment where all participants are required to actively serve as crew members. This structure emphasizes teamwork, responsibility, and practical skill-building. During the sails, students will engage in essential maritime activities such as standing watch, setting and striking sails, basic radio communications, tying knots, and practicing helmsmanship.

In addition to these technical skills, the program will expose students to the many career paths available in the maritime industry. By providing this hands-on exposure, we aim to inspire the next generation of maritime professionals and equip them with the knowledge and skills needed to pursue these opportunities.

With the support of grant funding, Marimed seeks to make these day sails accessible to students across Hawai'i, fostering a stronger connection to Hawai'i's maritime heritage of while empowering participants to explore and pursue rewarding careers in the maritime field.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

In Hawai'i, the maritime industry stands as a cornerstone of the state's economy, supporting vital trade and commerce by connecting Hawai'i to the global market. Approximately 90% of all products in Hawai'i are delivered by merchant ships, highlighting the central role the maritime sector plays in ensuring the availability of goods

for residents and businesses. Despite this, many young people in Hawai'i are not aware of the wide range of career opportunities within the maritime industry. This gap in exposure means that youth may miss out on discovering well-paying careers that can offer stability and long-term growth. It is crucial to raise awareness about these careers and encourage the younger generation to explore the variety of pathways available in maritime industry.

The maritime industry is not only vital for the state's economy but also offers well-paying career opportunities. Many positions within the industry provide living wages, often with benefits such as health insurance, retirement plans, and opportunities for advancement. Whether on the waterfront, aboard a vessel, or shipbuilding, youth can find rewarding jobs that offer financial security and personal growth. These careers do not require a four-year degree, making them accessible to a wide range of learners, including those who might prefer hands-on work or practical learning environments. The maritime sector, thus, offers youth an alternative to the traditional college route while ensuring they have access to sustainable livelihoods.

Exposing youth to maritime careers helps combat the ongoing shortage of skilled workers in the industry. As older generations retire, there is an increasing need for young workers to step in and fill critical roles across various maritime sectors. This shortage is particularly pronounced in Hawai'i, where the geographical isolation and reliance on sea trade create a constant demand for well-trained personnel. By fostering early interest and providing education on maritime pathways, Hawai'i can ensure a steady supply of skilled workers for the future, meeting both the immediate and long-term needs of the industry.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

The Marimed Foundation plans to serve 420 middle and high school students across Hawai'i, offering them the opportunity to explore maritime career pathways while gaining hands-on experience. The goal is to foster interest in the maritime industry and inspire students to consider it as a viable career option.

5. Describe the geographic coverage.

This grant will serve participants on the five major islands throughout the 12-month grant period.

Program Director Responsibilities:

The Program Director will oversee the entire day sail program, from logistics and scheduling to student engagement and program development. They will ensure effective communication between schools, the Marimed Foundation, and other community partners. The Program Director will also be responsible for managing staff, providing training, and maintaining safety protocols. Additionally, they will track and evaluate the program's success, ensuring it meets educational objectives and provides a positive experience for all students.

Marimed plans to provide to complete the project with the following timeline: July 2025-December 2025- 12- one day sails January 2026-June 2026- 12- one day sails

Knowledge Assessment: Prior to the day sail, participants and their parent/guardian will attend a pre-sail meeting where participants will complete a survey assessing their current knowledge of maritime careers. This follow-up ensures that their judgments are not solely influenced by the enjoyable experience aboard the ship. The goal is for 70% of participants to express a genuine interest in pursuing a maritime career, with survey results compiled and reported to the State.

It features both inside and outside wheelhouses and meets all stringent U.S. Coast Guard requirements for sailing school vessels. Safety is a top priority, with redundant safety and communication systems, a rescue boat, an aft dinghy, and two 25-person life rafts. Additionally, all sail trainees are required to wear safety harnesses while aboard, regardless of the sailing location.


Captain
