ACT 220 S.B. NO. 5.D. 2 H.D. 2 C.D. 1

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is currently a
- 2 statewide physician shortage. According to the federal Health
- 3 Resources and Services Administration, each county in the State
- 4 contains a region that is a medically underserved area, as
- 5 defined by the Public Health Service Act of 1944, Public Law
- 6 78-410.
- 7 The legislature further finds that pharmacists can help
- 8 bridge the gaps created by the physician shortage. A
- 9 pharmacist's skill set includes educating patients on how and
- 10 when to check blood sugar, ways to avoid and manage
- 11 hypoglycemia, how to take their medications correctly to avoid
- 12 adverse effects, and various medication utilization techniques.
- 13 Additionally, patients are significantly less likely to be
- 14 readmitted to the hospital when pharmacists provide clinical
- 15 services after a hospital discharge.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require private
- 17 and public health plans issued in the State to recognize

6	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended b	y adding a new section to article 10A to be
8	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:

10	pharmacis	ts; coverage. (a) Each individual or group policy of
11	accident	and health or sickness insurance delivered or issued
12	for deliv	ery in the State on or after July 1, 2026, shall:
13	(1)	Recognize pharmacists licensed pursuant to chapter 461
14		as participating providers;
15	(2)	Include coverage for a service provided by a
16		participating registered pharmacist practicing within
17		the scope of the participating registered pharmacist's
18		license for purposes of health maintenance or
19		treatment to the extent that the policy provides
20		coverage for the same service rendered by another
21		health care provider; and

1	(3)	Pay or reimburse a pharmacist or pharmacy for the cost
2		of a service provided by a pharmacist within the scope
3		of the pharmacist's practice.
4	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "participating
5	registere	d pharmacist" means a registered pharmacist licensed
6	pursuant	to chapter 461 who has contracted with the insurer to
7	provide h	ealth care services to its insureds."
8	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended b	y adding a new section to article 1 to be appropriately
10	designate	d and to read as follows:
11	" <u>§43</u>	2:1- Services provided by participating registered
12	pharmacis	ts; coverage. (a) Each individual or group hospital
13	or medica	l service plan contract delivered or issued for
14	delivery	in the State on or after July 1, 2026, shall:
15	(1)	Recognize pharmacists licensed pursuant to chapter 461
16		as participating providers;
17	(2)	Provide coverage for a service provided by a
18		participating registered pharmacist practicing within
19		the scope of the participating registered pharmacist's
20		license for purposes of health maintenance or
21		treatment to the extent that the plan contract

1		provides coverage for the same service rendered by	
2		another health care provider; and	
3	(3)	Pay or reimburse a pharmacist or pharmacy for the cost	
4		of a service performed by a pharmacist within the	
5		scope of the pharmacist's practice.	
6	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "participating	
7	registere	d pharmacist" means a registered pharmacist licensed	
8	pursuant to chapter 461 who has contracted with the mutual		
9	benefit society to provide health care services to its		
10	subscribers or members."		
11	SECT	ION 4. Chapter 432D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	" <u>§</u> 43	2D- Services provided by participating registered	
15	pharmacis	ts; coverage. (a) Each health maintenance	
16	organizat	ion policy, contract, plan, or agreement that is	
17	issued, a	mended, or renewed in the State on or after July 1,	
18	2026, sha	11:	
19	(1)	Recognize pharmacists licensed pursuant to chapter 461	
20		as participating providers;	

1	(2)	Provide coverage for a service provided by a
2		participating registered pharmacist practicing within
3		the scope of the participating registered pharmacist's
4		license for purposes of health maintenance or
5		treatment to the extent that the plan contract
6		provides coverage for the same service rendered by
7		another health care provider; and
8	<u>(3)</u>	Pay or reimburse a pharmacist or pharmacy for the cost
9		of a service provided by a pharmacist within the scope
10		of the pharmacist's practice.
11	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "participating
12	registere	d pharmacist" means a registered pharmacist licensed
13	pursuant	to chapter 461 who has contracted with the health
14	maintenan	ce organization to provide health care services to its
15	enrollees	or subscribers."
16	SECT	ION 5. Section 346-59, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
18	"(b)	Rates of payment to providers of medical care who are
19	individua	l practitioners, including doctors of medicine,
20		podiatrists, psychologists, osteopaths, optometrists,
21		ts, and other individuals providing services, shall be
	PHATMACIS	co, and other individuals providing services, shall be

- 1 based upon the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. The amounts paid
- 2 shall not exceed the maximum permitted to be paid individual
- 3 practitioners or other individuals under federal law and
- 4 regulation, the medicare fee schedule for the current year, the
- 5 state limits as provided in the appropriation act, or the
- 6 provider's billed amount.
- 7 The appropriation act shall indicate the percentage of the
- 8 medicare fee schedule for the year 2000 to be used as the basis
- 9 for establishing the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. For any
- 10 subsequent adjustments to the fee schedule, the legislature
- 11 shall specify the extent of the adjustment in the appropriation
- 12 act."
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- "(g) For the purposes of this section:
- "Distant site" means the location of the health care
- 17 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
- 18 services are provided.
- "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
- 20 defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
- 21 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in

- 1 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
- 2 practitioners licensed by the State and working within their
- 3 scope of practice, and any other person or organization who
- 4 furnishes, bills, or is paid for health care in the normal
- 5 course of business, including but not limited to primary care
- 6 providers, mental health providers, oral health providers,
- 7 physicians and osteopathic physicians licensed under
- 8 chapter 453, advanced practice registered nurses licensed under
- 9 chapter 457, psychologists licensed under chapter 465,
- 10 pharmacists licensed under chapter 461, and dentists licensed
- 11 under chapter 448.
- "Interactive telecommunications system" has the same
- 13 meaning as the term is defined in title 42 Code of Federal
- 14 Regulations section 410.78(a).
- 15 "Originating site" means the location where the patient is
- 16 located, whether accompanied or not by a health care provider,
- 17 at the time services are provided by a health care provider
- 18 through telehealth, including but not limited to a health care
- 19 provider's office, hospital, critical access hospital, rural
- 20 health clinic, federally qualified health center, a patient's
- 21 home, and other nonmedical environments such as school-based

- 1 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work
- 2 location of a patient.
- 3 "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications services,
- 4 as defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities:
- 5 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live
- 6 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not
- 7 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication,
- 8 secure interactive and non-interactive web-based communication,
- 9 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
- 10 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality
- 11 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation
- 12 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health
- 13 care services and information while a patient is at an
- 14 originating site and the health care provider is at a distant
- 15 site. Except as provided through an interactive
- 16 telecommunications system, standard telephone contacts,
- 17 facsimile transmissions, or e-mail text, in combination or
- 18 alone, do not constitute telehealth services."
- 19 SECTION 7. The department of human services shall apply to
- 20 the United States Department of Health and Human Services for

- 1 any amendment to the state medicaid plan or for any medicaid
- 2 waiver necessary to implement sections 5 and 6 of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 9 provided that sections 5 and 6 shall take effect upon approval
- 10 of the Hawaii medicaid state plan by the Centers for Medicare
- 11 and Medicaid Services; provided further that the amendments made
- 12 to section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by section 6 of
- 13 this Act shall not be repealed when that section is reenacted on
- 14 December 31, 2025, pursuant to section 8 of Act 107, Session
- 15 Laws of Hawaii 2023.
