
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR CULTURAL AND TECHNICAL INTERCHANGE
BETWEEN EAST AND WEST, INC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Center for
2 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West Act of
3 1960, *P.L. 86-472*, authorized the establishment in Hawaii of a
4 center for cultural and technical interchange between East and
5 West. Act 82, Session Laws of Hawaii 1975, established an
6 educational non-profit public corporation, the Center for
7 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc.,
8 to administer and operate the center.

9 The legislature further finds that the established center
10 for cultural and technical interchange between East and West,
11 better known and hereinafter referred to as the "East-West
12 Center", has become a pivotal institution in fostering
13 understanding and cooperation between the United States and the
14 nations of Asia and the Pacific. Hawaii's unique geographical
15 location and multicultural heritage make it an ideal location
16 for promoting international relations, particularly within the
17 Asia-Pacific region. For over six decades, the East-West Center

1 has significantly contributed to Hawaii's role as a bridge
2 between the East and West, enhancing the state's position in
3 international affairs.

4 The legislature further finds that the East-West Center's
5 programs in research, education, and exchange have directly
6 benefited Hawaii's economy, culture, and diplomatic relations.
7 While the federal government has provided significant funding to
8 the East-West Center, this federal support has fluctuated over
9 the years. The legislature recognizes that the center would
10 benefit from regular, predictable State resources to support the
11 development of programs and initiatives that align with Hawaii's
12 strategic goals in international relations, education, and
13 economic development.

14 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to authorize from the
15 general revenues of the State of Hawaii and exempt from the
16 requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, an annual
17 appropriation in the State's executive budget to the Center for
18 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc.

19 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
21 designated and to read as follows:

1 "§201- East-West center. (a) The official designation
2 of the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between
3 East and West, Inc., a Hawaii educational non-profit public
4 corporation established in Hawaii pursuant to Act 82, Session
5 Laws of Hawaii 1975, shall be the State of Hawaii Center for
6 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc.
7 The qualifying standards and conditions related to the receipt
8 of funds under chapter 42F shall not apply to funds received by
9 the State of Hawaii Center for Cultural and Technical
10 Interchange Between East and West, Inc.; provided that if the
11 center contracts with a recipient or provider, then the
12 qualifying standards, conditions, and other provisions of
13 chapter 42F shall apply to the recipient or provider and the
14 contract.

15 (b) To receive state funds, the State of Hawaii Center for
16 Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc.,
17 shall:

18 (1) Be licensed or accredited, in accordance with federal,
19 state, or county statutes, rules, or ordinances, to
20 conduct the activities or provide the services for
21 which funds are appropriated;

- 1 (2) Comply with all applicable federal and state laws
2 prohibiting discrimination against any person on the
3 basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
4 creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability;
5 (3) Agree not to use the funds for entertainment or
6 lobbying activities;
7 (4) Be incorporated under the laws of the State;
8 (5) Have bylaws or policies that describe the manner in
9 which the activities or services for which funds are
10 awarded shall be conducted or provided;
11 (6) Have been determined and designated to be a tax-exempt
12 organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and
13 (7) Have a governing board whose members shall have no
14 material conflict of interest and serve without
15 compensation.
16 (c) The comptroller and state auditor shall have the
17 authority to examine the use of funds appropriated to the State
18 of Hawaii Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between
19 East and West, Inc."

20 SECTION 4. This Act and its designation of State support
21 shall not impinge upon the autonomy of the State of Hawaii
22 Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and

1 West, Inc., nor imply State control over its programs or
2 policies, except as specifically provided for in section 2 of
3 this Act.

4 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

Designates the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., as the State of Hawaii Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc. Authorizes General Fund appropriations exempt from the requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the State of Hawaii Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Business, Economic Development, and Tourism

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR CULTURAL AND TECHNICAL INTERCHANGE BETWEEN EAST AND WEST, INC.

PURPOSE: To designate the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., as the State of Hawaii Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., and authorize General Fund appropriations exempt from the requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to the center.

MEANS: Add a new section to part I of chapter 201, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: The Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West Act of 1960, P.L. 86-472, authorized the establishment in Hawaii of a center for cultural and technical interchange between East and West. Act 82, Session Laws of Hawaii 1975, established an educational non-profit public corporation, the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., to administer and operate the center.

The established center for cultural and technical interchange between East and West, better known and hereinafter referred to as the "East-West Center", has significantly contributed to Hawaii's role as a bridge between the East and West, enhancing the State's position in international affairs. While the federal government has provided significant funding to the East-West Center, this federal support has fluctuated over the years. The East-West Center would benefit from regular, predictable State resources to support the development of programs and initiatives that align with Hawaii's strategic goals in international relations,

education, and economic development. Exempting the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West, Inc., from chapter 42F, HRS, would facilitate funding for the East-West Center's programs.

Impact on the public: This bill will enhance Hawaii's capacity to engage in international diplomacy, cultural exchange, and economic cooperation.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The department will need to work with the Department of Budget and Finance and Department of Accounting and General Services to release and process funds.
