4 SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue
5 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$35,683,500 or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2025-2026
8 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the fortieth
9 representative district, as follows:

10 1. Highway construction

11 A. Design and construction for a sidewalk gap on Fort
12 Weaver Road from Geiger Road to Keoneula Boulevard.

 5 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;
 6 provided that all moneys from the appropriation that are
 7 unencumbered as of June 30, 2028, shall lapse as of that date.


8 SECTION 4. The sums appropriated for the respective
 9 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the
 10 department of education for the purposes of this Act.

11 SECTION 5. The sums appropriated for the respective
 12 capital projects set forth in section 2 shall be expended by the
 13 department of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
