
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is currently a
2 statewide physician shortage. According to the federal Health
3 Resources and Services Administration, each county in the State
4 contains a region that is a medically underserved area, as
5 defined by the Public Health Service Act of 1944, Public Law
6 78-410.

7 The legislature further finds that pharmacists can help
8 bridge the gaps created by the physician shortage. A
9 pharmacist's skill set includes educating patients on how and
10 when to check blood sugar, ways to avoid and manage
11 hypoglycemia, how to take their medications correctly to avoid
12 adverse effects, and various medication utilization techniques.
13 Additionally, patients are significantly less likely to be
14 readmitted to the hospital when pharmacists provide clinical
15 services after a hospital discharge.

16 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require private
17 and public health plans issued in the State to recognize



1 licensed pharmacists as participating providers and mandate
2 payment or reimbursement for services provided by participating
3 registered pharmacists within their scope of practice to the
4 extent that the policy or plan provides coverage for the same
5 service rendered by another health care provider.

6 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by adding a new section to article 10A to be
8 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

9 "§431:10A- Services provided by participating registered
10 pharmacists; coverage. (a) Each individual or group policy of
11 accident and health or sickness insurance delivered or issued
12 for delivery in the State on or after July 1, 2026, shall:

13 (1) Recognize pharmacists licensed pursuant to chapter 461
14 as participating providers;

15 (2) Include coverage for a service provided by a
16 participating registered pharmacist practicing within
17 the scope of their license for purposes of health
18 maintenance or treatment to the extent that the policy
19 provides coverage for the same service rendered by
20 another health care provider; and



1 (3) Pay or reimburse a pharmacist or pharmacy for the cost
2 of a service performed by a pharmacist within the
3 scope of their practice.

4 (b) For the purposes of this section, "participating
5 registered pharmacist" means a pharmacist licensed pursuant to
6 chapter 461 who has contracted with the insurer to provide
7 health care services to its insureds."

8 SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by adding a new section to article 1 to be appropriately
10 designated and to read as follows:

11 "§432:1- Services provided by participating registered
12 pharmacists; coverage. (a) Each individual and group hospital
13 or medical service plan contract delivered or issued for
14 delivery in the State on or after July 1, 2026, by a mutual
15 benefit society shall:

16 (1) Recognize pharmacists licensed pursuant to chapter 461
17 as participating providers;

18 (2) Provide coverage for a service provided by a
19 participating registered pharmacist practicing within
20 the scope of their license for purposes of health
21 maintenance or treatment to the extent that the plan



1 contract provides coverage for the same service
2 rendered by another health care provider; and
3 (3) Pay or reimburse a pharmacist or pharmacy for the cost
4 of a service performed by a pharmacist within the
5 scope of their practice.

6 (b) For the purposes of this section, "participating
7 registered pharmacist" means a pharmacist licensed pursuant to
8 chapter 461 who has contracted with the mutual benefit society
9 to provide health care services to its members."

10 SECTION 4. Section 346-59, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12 "(b) Rates of payment to providers of medical care who are
13 individual practitioners, including doctors of medicine,
14 dentists, podiatrists, psychologists, osteopaths, optometrists,
15 pharmacists, and other individuals providing services, shall be
16 based upon the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. The amounts paid
17 shall not exceed the maximum permitted to be paid individual
18 practitioners or other individuals under federal law and
19 regulation, the medicare fee schedule for the current year, the
20 state limits as provided in the appropriation act, or the
21 provider's billed amount.

1 The appropriation act shall indicate the percentage of the
2 medicare fee schedule for the year 2000 to be used as the basis
3 for establishing the Hawaii medicaid fee schedule. For any
4 subsequent adjustments to the fee schedule, the legislature
5 shall specify the extent of the adjustment in the appropriation
6 act."

7 SECTION 5. Section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

9 "(g) For the purposes of this section:

10 "Distant site" means the location of the health care
11 provider delivering services through telehealth at the time the
12 services are provided.

13 "Health care provider" means a provider of services, as
14 defined in title 42 United States Code section 1395x(u), a
15 provider of medical and other health services, as defined in
16 title 42 United States Code section 1395x(s), other
17 practitioners licensed by the State and working within their
18 scope of practice, and any other person or organization who
19 furnishes, bills, or is paid for health care in the normal
20 course of business, including but not limited to primary care
21 providers, mental health providers, oral health providers,



1 physicians and osteopathic physicians licensed under
2 chapter 453, advanced practice registered nurses licensed under
3 chapter 457, psychologists licensed under chapter 465,
4 pharmacists licensed under chapter 461, and dentists licensed
5 under chapter 448.

6 "Interactive telecommunications system" has the same
7 meaning as the term is defined in title 42 Code of Federal
8 Regulations section 410.78(a).

9 "Originating site" means the location where the patient is
10 located, whether accompanied or not by a health care provider,
11 at the time services are provided by a health care provider
12 through telehealth, including but not limited to a health care
13 provider's office, hospital, critical access hospital, rural
14 health clinic, federally qualified health center, a patient's
15 home, and other nonmedical environments such as school-based
16 health centers, university-based health centers, or the work
17 location of a patient.

18 "Telehealth" means the use of telecommunications services,
19 as defined in section 269-1, to encompass four modalities:
20 store and forward technologies, remote monitoring, live
21 consultation, and mobile health; and which shall include but not



1 be limited to real-time video conferencing-based communication,
2 secure interactive and non-interactive web-based communication,
3 and secure asynchronous information exchange, to transmit
4 patient medical information, including diagnostic-quality
5 digital images and laboratory results for medical interpretation
6 and diagnosis, for the purpose of delivering enhanced health
7 care services and information while a patient is at an
8 originating site and the health care provider is at a distant
9 site. Except as provided through an interactive
10 telecommunications system, standard telephone contacts,
11 facsimile transmissions, or e-mail text, in combination or
12 alone, do not constitute telehealth services."

13 SECTION 6. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 **"§432D-23 Required provisions and benefits.**

16 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each
17 policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after
18 January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to
19 this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections
20 431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116,
21 431:10A-116.2, 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119,



1 431:10A-120, 431:10A-121, 431:10A-122, 431:10A-125, 431:10A-126,
2 431:10A-132, 431:10A-133, 431:10A-134, 431:10A-140, and
3 [~~431:10A-134~~] 431:10A- , and chapter 431M."

4 SECTION 7. The department of human services shall apply to
5 the United States Department of Health and Human Services for
6 any amendment to the state medicaid plan or for any medicaid
7 waiver necessary to implement section 4 and section 5 of this
8 Act.

9 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11 begun before its effective date.

12 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

14 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on
15 December 31, 2050; provided that sections 4 and 5 shall take
16 effect upon approval of the Hawaii medicaid state plan by the
17 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; provided further
18 that the amendments made to section 346-59.1, Hawaii Revised
19 Statutes, by section 5 of this Act shall not be repealed when
20 that section is reenacted on December 31, 2025, pursuant to
21 section 8 of Act 107, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023.

Insurance Coverage; Pharmacists; Reimbursement

Description:

Beginning 7/1/2026, mandates reimbursement for services provided by participating registered pharmacists practicing within their scope of practice by private and public health plans in the State and requires the health plans to recognize pharmacists licensed in the State as participating providers. Effective 12/31/2050. (SD2)

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
