
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEPARTMENTAL DATA SHARING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide
2 longitudinal data system stores and analyzes career and
3 technical education data it receives from all state educational
4 systems and workforce training agencies to support research and
5 evaluation that will improve outcomes throughout the early
6 education to workforce pipeline. While other state agencies are
7 included in the system to provide data as appropriate, the
8 determination of whether or not data from another department is
9 appropriate is left to the department of education, the
10 executive office on early learning, the university of Hawaii,
11 the department of labor and industrial relations, and the
12 department of human services.

13 The legislature further finds that data currently collected
14 by state educational systems and workforce training agencies
15 does not include information from certain segments of Hawaii's
16 workforce, such as those who are self-employed. This leaves the
17 current workforce data incomplete. Gathering data from the tax



1 filings of those who are self-employed will provide a more
2 accurate analysis of the State's workforce.

3 The purpose of this Act is to include the department of
4 taxation and department of business, economic development, and
5 tourism in the departmental data sharing to allow for a more
6 accurate analysis of the State's workforce.

7 SECTION 2. Section 27-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 "**§27-7 Departmental data sharing.** (a) The department of
10 education[τ]; the executive office on early learning[τ]; the
11 [University] university of Hawaii[τ]; the department of labor
12 and industrial relations[τ]; the department of human
13 services[τ]; the department of taxation; the department of
14 business, economic development, and tourism; and other state
15 agencies, as appropriate, shall share data through the statewide
16 longitudinal data system to support research and evaluation that
17 will improve outcomes throughout the early education to
18 workforce pipeline. The data to be shared shall be determined
19 jointly by the department of education[τ]; the executive office
20 on early learning[τ]; the [University] university of Hawaii[τ];
21 the department of labor and industrial relations[τ]; the



1 department of human services[7]; the department of taxation; the
2 department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
3 other state agencies, as appropriate, and shall be shared no
4 less than annually[7]; provided that any data provided by the
5 department of business, economic development, and tourism and
6 department of taxation shall also be aggregated or anonymized.

7 (b) The department of education[7]; the executive office
8 on early learning[7]; the [University] university of Hawaii[7];
9 the department of labor and industrial relations[7]; the
10 department of human services[7]; the department of taxation; the
11 department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
12 other state agencies, as appropriate, shall share data in a
13 manner that safeguards the confidentiality of student education
14 records, as defined by the federal Family Educational Rights and
15 Privacy Act, and workforce data, as provided by applicable
16 federal and state laws, rules, and regulations.

17 (c) The statewide longitudinal data system shall store and
18 analyze career and technical education data it receives from all
19 state educational systems and workforce training agencies
20 pursuant to section 304A-304 to analyze the cross-agency
21 longitudinal education and workforce outcomes of students who



1 attempted an educational course, training program, career
2 program, postsecondary program, or other state-supported
3 workforce training program. Data to be shared shall be
4 determined jointly by the relevant agencies and shall be shared
5 no less than annually.

6 (d) All data shared by or with the department of human
7 services[7]; department of taxation; department of business,
8 economic development, and tourism; department of education[7];
9 public charter school authorizers[7]; public charter schools[7];
10 executive office on early learning[7]; and other entities as
11 required by statute shall be subject to any state or federal
12 laws and any administrative rule regarding privacy adopted by
13 the department or agency that collected the data.

14 (e) The department of education[7]; the executive office
15 on early learning[7]; the [University] university of Hawaii[7];
16 the department of labor and industrial relations[7]; the
17 department of human services[7]; the department of taxation; the
18 department of business, economic development, and tourism; and
19 other state agencies, as appropriate, shall partner to
20 collectively govern the statewide longitudinal data system and
21 determine protocols to:



1 (1) Prioritize analyses and research questions that will
2 provide information to improve educational and
3 workforce outcomes and policies; and

4 (2) Approve requests for access to data provided by the
5 department of education~~[7]~~; the executive office on
6 early learning~~[7]~~; the ~~[University]~~ university of
7 Hawaii~~[7]~~; the department of labor and industrial
8 relations~~[7]~~; the department of human services~~[7]~~; the
9 department of taxation; the department of business,
10 economic development, and tourism; and other state
11 agencies, as appropriate.

12 (f) All state agency directors shall consider sharing data
13 for the statewide longitudinal data system."

14 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Adds the Department of Taxation and Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to the list of state agencies required to share data and determine the data to be shared through the Statewide Longitudinal Data System.
