BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 515-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>"</u> Di	scriminatory restrictive covenant" means any
5	restricti	ve covenant on real property which, if enforced, would
6	violate:	
7	(1)	The prohibition in the federal Fair Housing Act (42
8		U.S.C. 3601 et seq.) against discrimination on the
9		basis of race, color, sex, religion, familial status,
10		disability, or national origin; or
11	(2)	The equal protection clause of the United States
12		Constitution under Shelley v. Kraemer, 334 U.S. 1
13		(1984) (holding enforcement of a racially restrictive
14		covenant violates the equal protection clause)."
15	SECT	ION 2. Section 515-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:

Every

2 provision in an oral agreement or a written instrument relating 3 to real property that purports to forbid or restrict the conveyance, encumbrance, occupancy, or lease thereof to 4 5 individuals because of race, sex, including gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, color, religion, marital status, 6 7 familial status, ancestry, disability, age, or human 8 immunodeficiency virus infection, is void. 9 (b) Every condition, restriction, or prohibition, 10 including a right of entry or possibility of reverter, that 11 directly or indirectly limits the use or occupancy of real 12 property on the basis of race, sex, including gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, color, religion, marital status, 13 14 familial status, ancestry, disability, age, or human 15 immunodeficiency virus infection is void, except a limitation, 16 on the basis of religion, on the use of real property held by a religious institution or organization or by a religious or 17 18 charitable organization operated, supervised, or controlled by a 19 religious institution or organization, and used for religious or 20 charitable purposes.

1	(6)	It is a discriminatory practice to insert in a written
2	instrumen	t relating to real property a provision that is void
3	under thi	s section or to honor or attempt to honor [such] a
4	provision	in the chain of title.
5	<u>(d)</u>	Any person who discovers a recorded discriminatory
6	restricti	ve covenant may:
7	(1)	With the consent of all parties to a real estate
8		transaction, include in any deed, mortgage, or other
9		instrument filed for recording in connection with the
10		transaction a statement that the discriminatory
11		restrictive covenant is invalid and unenforceable; or
12	(2)	Prepare and record a separate notice, cross-referenced
13		to the discriminatory restrictive covenant, stating
14		that the discriminatory restrictive covenant is
15		invalid and unenforceable.
16	(e)	The statement or notice described under subsection (d)
17	shall be	in a form substantially consistent with the following:
18	"The	chain of title for the real property described
19	here	in contains a restrictive covenant that, if
20	enfo	rced, would discriminate against individuals based
21	upon	their race, color, sex, religion, familial

1	status, disability, or national origin. The covenant
2	is invalid, unenforceable, and antithetical to
3	American values of equal justice and equality under
4	the law."
5	(f) A person who in good faith:
6	(1) Prepares or causes to be prepared; or
7	(2) Records or causes to be recorded;
8	a statement or notice under subsection (d) is immune from
9	liability for incorrectly stating that the restrictive covenant
10	is discriminatory."
11	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
