SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO CONVENE A TOURISM AND GAMING WORKING GROUP.

WHEREAS, under existing law, gaming, also known as gambling, is largely prohibited within the State; and

WHEREAS, legislation to legalize gaming has been introduced in past legislative sessions; and

WHEREAS, gaming activities operated within a comprehensive policy framework may lead to economic growth and provide a significant source of tax revenue; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature needs useful information, 12 evaluated and prepared by stakeholders, to properly consider such a framework; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to convene a Tourism and Gaming Working Group; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to:

- (1) Review gaming legislation that has been considered by the Legislature to determine if any proposal has the potential to be implemented in the State;
- Develop a comprehensive tourism gaming policy framework that would serve as a catalyst for economic growth, job creation, capital investment, and a significant source of tax revenue for the State;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to dissolve the Tourism and Gaming Working Group on June 30, 2028; and
