SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO AMEND ITS TECHNOLOGY MONITORING POLICIES AND GUIDELINES TO INCLUDE MONITORING THAT BLOCKS STUDENTS FROM RECEIVING INAPPROPRIATE MESSAGES AND ACCESSING HARMFUL MATERIAL.

1 WHEREAS, in July 2016, the Department of Education issued
2 the most recent "Technology Responsible Use Guidelines (for
3 digital devices, network, and internet services owned and leased
4 by the Hawaii State Department of Education for its students)";
5 and

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7 WHEREAS, the guidelines section entitled "Monitoring for
8 student safety" is almost completely unrelated to the safety of
9 the students being monitored and states:

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11 Monitoring for student safety

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13 Devices and accounts accessing HIDOE Internet and
14 Networks are the property of HIDOE. HIDOE monitors
15 and reserves the right to monitor all such devices,
16 networks, and internet activities by students.
17 Students shall have no expectation of privacy in their
18 use of HIDOE-owned digital devices, network, and
19 internet services, including email and stored files.
20 HIDOE at its discretion will alert appropriate law
21 enforcement authorities of suspected illegal activity
22 involving the use of the digital devices and network
23 and internet services, and it is not required to
24 obtain student or parent consent for such reporting.
25 HIDOE reserves the right to review and remove any
26 student's files and records used on HIDOE devices and
27 accounts to maintain the integrity of the network, to
28 repair a HIDOE digital device, investigate a violation



1 of these guidelines, and to ensure that the digital
2 device is being used responsibly.

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6 WHEREAS, it appears that the intent of the "Monitoring for
7 student safety" and the guidelines is to protect the department
8 from liability and prevent harm to the network and equipment;
9 and

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11 WHEREAS, the guidelines do not contain any monitoring
12 provisions for the protection of students, especially at-risk
13 and other youth vulnerable to neglect, abuse, violence,
14 substance abuse, suicide, sex trafficking, and other sexual
15 exploitation; and

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17 WHEREAS, students, including special needs students, using
18 social media, Google Classroom, and email have received
19 inappropriate messages through their school accounts and
20 department devices; and

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22 WHEREAS, forty-six percent of teens ages thirteen to
23 seventeen have been victims of cyberbullying; and

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25 WHEREAS, in the United States, nearly forty percent of sex
26 trafficking victims are recruited online through employment
27 portals and social networking websites; and

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29 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's technology
30 guidelines should include monitoring that protects students,
31 with an emphasis on protecting at-risk, special needs, and other
32 vulnerable students, by preventing inappropriate messages that
33 harm students and intervening when students encounter
34 information that could lead to harm; now, therefore,

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36 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
37 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the
38 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
39 Education is requested to amend its technology monitoring
40 policies and guidelines to include monitoring that blocks
41 students from receiving inappropriate messages and accessing
42 harmful material; and


