SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO STUDY THE IMPACT OF
UNINSURED MOTORISTS IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii state law requires that all drivers have
2 motor vehicle insurance; and

3
4 WHEREAS, despite this requirement, an estimated eleven
5 percent of motorists in Hawaii operate vehicles without valid
6 motor vehicle insurance coverage, placing financial and
7 emotional burdens on drivers involved in accidents with
8 uninsured motorists; and

10 WHEREAS, the presence of uninsured motorists has led to
11 increased costs of premiums for insured motorists, as insurance
12 companies adjust rates to account for the additional risk posed
13 by uninsured motorists; and

15 WHEREAS, uninsured motorists can exacerbate the financial
16 strain on victims of motor vehicle accidents, particularly those
17 who may lack adequate uninsured motorist coverage; and

19 WHEREAS, a comprehensive understanding of the prevalence
20 and impact of uninsured motorists in Hawaii is essential for
21 developing effective policies to address this issue and protect
22 the financial well-being of the State's residents; now,
23 therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the
27 House of Representatives concurring, that the Insurance
28 Commissioner is requested to conduct a study on the impact of
29 uninsured motorists in Hawaii, including:

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Insurance Commissioner is
11 requested to submit a report of the study, including any
12 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty
13 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Insurance Commissioner.
