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# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO  
CONVENE AND PROVIDE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANCE TO A  
DESALINATION PLANNING TASK FORCE TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE  
USE OF DESALINATION FOR LARGE-SCALE WATER CONSUMPTION IN  
THE STATE IS FEASIBLE.

1           WHEREAS, freshwater scarcity is an increasingly present  
2 threat to communities around the world in the face of population  
3 growth and climate change; and  
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5           WHEREAS, freshwater is vital not only to the sustenance of  
6 life in the State, but also its economy and culture, including  
7 supporting agricultural production and tourism; and  
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9           WHEREAS, islands like O‘ahu rely on underground aquifers for  
10 their freshwater supply; and  
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12           WHEREAS, underground aquifers take decades to replenish  
13 naturally and are susceptible to chemical spills and leaks,  
14 droughts, and commercial overuse; and  
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16           WHEREAS, a decrease of rainfall of eighteen percent over  
17 the last thirty years, a population that has doubled since 1959,  
18 constantly rising visitor levels, and the destruction of half of  
19 its watershed forests have contributed to a freshwater crisis in  
20 the State; and  
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22           WHEREAS, desalination, the process of removing salt from  
23 seawater, offers a promising solution to the freshwater scarcity  
24 crisis; and  
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26           WHEREAS, despite the abundance of seawater surrounding the  
27 State and need for an alternative source of freshwater,  
28 desalination can be cost-prohibitive and energy-intensive,



1 necessitating a thorough examination of whether it is the  
2 solution best suited to the State's needs; now, therefore,

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4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third  
5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the  
6 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land  
7 and Natural Resources is requested to convene and provide  
8 administrative assistance to a Desalination Planning Task Force  
9 to determine whether the use of desalination for large-scale  
10 water consumption in the State is feasible; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to  
13 consist of the following members:

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- 15 (1) The Chairperson of the Commission on Water Resource
- 16 Management or the Chairperson's designee, who shall
- 17 serve as Chair of the Task Force;
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- 19 (2) The Director of Health or the Director's designee;
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- 21 (3) The Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture or the
- 22 Chairperson's designee;
- 23
- 24 (4) The Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian
- 25 Affairs or the Chief Executive Officer's designee;
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- 27 (5) The Chairs of the Senate and House of Representatives
- 28 Standing Committees with primary jurisdiction over
- 29 water and land or their designees; and
- 30
- 31 (6) The Director or Manager and Chief Engineer of each
- 32 county's Department or Board of Water Supply; and
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34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to:

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- 36 (1) Conduct a study to determine the water demand for
- 37 housing, agriculture, and industrial uses throughout
- 38 the State, including in high-need areas;
- 39
- 40 (2) Examine the feasibility of using desalination as a
- 41 source of clean and safe drinking water to supplement



- 1 the State's existing groundwater and surface water
- 2 resources;
- 3
- 4 (3) Determine the extent to which the use of desalination
- 5 will:
- 6
- 7 (A) Assist the State in meeting its projected future
- 8 water needs; and
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- 10 (B) Improve the resiliency of the State's water
- 11 systems, considering in particular the impacts of
- 12 the water crisis caused by the contamination at
- 13 the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility;
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- 15 (4) Determine whether it is feasible for the Commission on
- 16 Water Resource Management to integrate desalination
- 17 into its overall water management plans;
- 18
- 19 (5) Consider the extent to which the construction of
- 20 desalination plants may affect or interfere with
- 21 historical sites and Native Hawaiian cultural sites
- 22 and practices, including burial sites; and
- 23
- 24 (6) Address environmental concerns associated with the
- 25 operation of desalination plants, including high
- 26 energy consumption and disposal of brine concentrate;
- 27 and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to  
 30 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including  
 31 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than  
 32 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of  
 33 2027; and

 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to  
 36 dissolve on June 30, 2027; and

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 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
 39 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the  
 40 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Director of Health,  
 41 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, Chief Executive Officer  
 42 of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and Mayors of each county.
