
SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OAHU METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION TO
CONTINUE TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT TRAINING PROGRAMS THAT
FOCUS ON EDUCATING KEY DECISION MAKERS RESPONSIBLE FOR
TRANSPORTATION POLICY, PLANNING, FUNDING, AND
IMPLEMENTATION.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has one of the highest costs of
2 transportation per capita in the country and among the highest
3 rates of transportation-related fatalities and injuries; and
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5 WHEREAS, different jurisdictions have tried to utilize a
6 number of different methods to achieve their transportation
7 safety goals and reduce the cost of multimodal and public
8 transit for local families; and
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10 WHEREAS, a number of other jurisdictions that struggled to
11 overcome similar transportation-related challenges as Hawaii
12 have managed to successfully reduce their cost of transportation
13 for residents over time, with some also having reduced
14 fatalities nearly to zero; and
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16 WHEREAS, Hawaii can learn from the proven lessons in other
17 jurisdictions and apply these strategies and best practices to
18 reduce its cost of transportation for local residents and
19 improve safety on roads and highways; and
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21 WHEREAS, some of the transportation-related challenges
22 Hawaii faces include a system of governance that involves
23 multiple agencies and levels of government that split the
24 decision-making process amongst a host of different officials;
25 and
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27 WHEREAS, joint policy and implementation strategy workshops
28 that engage multiple agencies and levels of government in
29 conversations with those who have successfully achieved progress
30 can help accelerate progress and success across silos; and
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1 WHEREAS, the Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization has
2 been operating a successful transportation project management
3 training program to help state and county decision makers and
4 employees working on transportation issues to meet with and
5 learn from their peers in other jurisdictions since 2023; and
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7 WHEREAS, successful transportation training programs
8 typically involve peer exchanges and mobile workshops where
9 participants meet and learn from their counterparts in other
10 model jurisdictions that have employed best practices, gain
11 firsthand experience as both designers and users of innovative
12 transportation infrastructure, and understand the unexpected and
13 unplanned for pros and cons of implemented solutions; and
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15 WHEREAS, state and county decision makers, including
16 employees, department heads, and elected and appointed officials
17 responsible for funding and implementing transit policy and
18 projects, would benefit from training programs involving
19 discussions with their peers in those jurisdictions that have
20 successfully improved transportation safety and cost; now,
21 therefore,
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23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-third
24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025,
25 that the Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization is requested to
26 continue transportation management training programs that focus
27 on educating key decision makers responsible for transportation
28 policy, planning, funding, and implementation; and
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30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the transportation management
31 training programs be designed to help decision makers achieve
32 state and county transportation goals including improving
33 transportation safety and providing a multimodal transportation
34 system that can expand opportunities for residents to lower
35 their transportation costs; and
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37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the transportation management
38 training programs also provide for peer-to-peer learning and
39 collaboration with other jurisdictions that demonstrate
40 implementation of innovative best practices and have achieved
41 successful outcomes; and
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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
2 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of
3 Transportation, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Mayor
4 of the County of Maui, Mayor of the County of Kauai, Mayor of
5 the County of Hawaii, Director of the Department of
6 Transportation Services, Director of the Maui County Department
7 of Transportation, and Executive Director of the Oahu
8 Metropolitan Planning Organization.
