Committee REFERRAL

RELATING TO EMERGENCY RESPONSE. HB816

HLT, FIN

Authorizes emergency medical technicians in the State to administer buprenorphine after the administration of an opioid antagonist during an opioid-related drug overdose response. Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules, allocate resources for EMT training, and coordinate with emergency medical services providers in the State, to incorporate the administration of buprenorphine after the administration of an opioid antagonist as a standard component of emergency medical services' protocols during an opioid-related drug overdose response.

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. HB817

HLT, CPC

Authorizes physicians to practice at organized ambulatory health care facilities even if the physician does not have hospital privileges at a licensed hospital in the same geographic location as the ambulatory facility. Provides that a written transfer agreement is not required to transfer a patient from an organized ambulatory health care facility to a licensed hospital.

Committee REFERRAL HB818 RELATING TO THE WAIAKEA COMMUNITY WAL, CPC, FIN DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. Establishes the Waiakea Peninsula Community Development District. Provides for the transfer of land and leases within the Waiakea Peninsula Community Development District from the Department of Land and Natural Resources to the Hawaii Community Development Authority. HB819 RELATING TO DISABILITY HEALTH DISPARITY. HLT, FIN Requires the State Council on Developmental Disabilities to collect data and submit to the Legislature a report focused on the health disparities experienced by individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities in the State prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2027. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. HB820 HLT, CPC, FIN Requires all health insurers in the State, including Medicaid managed care programs, to cover the cost of continuous glucose monitors and related supplies under certain conditions. Applies to insurance policies, contracts, plans, or agreements issued or renewed in the State after 12/31/2025. RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. TRN, FIN HB821 Requires the City and County of Honolulu to transfer to the State the City and County of Honolulu's authority to construct a Makakilo Drive extension. Appropriates moneys. **HB822** RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT. LAB, CPC, FIN Requires certain employers in the State to offer reproductive loss leave for employees. RELATING TO EMERGENCY EVACUATION ROUTES. HB823 TRN/PBS, WAL, Requires and appropriates moneys for the Department of **FIN** Transportation, in collaboration with the City and County of Honolulu, to assess and develop an improvement plan for emergency evacuation routes along the Waianae coast. Authorizes the Department to request input and assistance from the United States Navy. Requires a report to the Legislature. RELATING TO GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY. **HB824** LMG, FIN Appropriate funds to the legislative reference bureau to procure artificial intelligence software and analytic services to streamline

state law and regulations. Requires a report to the legislature.

HB825 RELATING TO NUISANCE ABATEMENT. JHA

Offers rights and protections to citizens who bring civil nuisance abatement suits related to illegal gambling. Imposes a mandatory fine of \$5,0000 for violating nuisance abatement laws related to gambling offenses.

RELATING TO HOUSING. HB826

HSG, JHA

Authorizes a county planning commission, by special permit, to permit land uses exclusively providing residential housing for long-term rental or affordable fee simple ownership in an

agricultural district, under certain conditions. Repeals 6/30/2035.

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION MEDICAL **HB827**

LAB, FIN

BENEFITS.

Expands workers' compensation medical benefits for firefighters to include coverage for adenocarcinoma or mesothelioma of the respiratory system; cancer of the buccal cavity, colon, pharynx, and thyroid; and malignant melanoma. Specifies that an employer may prove that the cancer or disease was not associated with the firefighting duties to deny medical benefits under workers' compensation law.

RELATING TO PLANT-BASED FOOD AND DRINKS. **HB828**

LAB, HLT, FIN

Requires state agencies to establish a Plant-Based-By-Default Program for food and drinks offered at state-operated prisons, state-licensed hospitals, and government-sponsored events. Requires the Director of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Comptroller, and Director of Health to submit annual reports to the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission. Effective 7/1/2026.

HB829 RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. JHA

Provides that leaders of nonprofit organizations shall be exempt from county liquor commission criminal history check requirements for license applicants.

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION REVIEWS. HB830

HSG, WAL, FIN

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to contract its review of proposed state projects, projects on privately owned historic property, and projects affecting historic properties to third-party consultants if the Department is unable

to complete its review within sixty days.

HB831 RELATING TO ANTITRUST.

CPC, JHA, FIN

Prohibits the use of algorithmic price-setting in Hawaii's rental market. Requires the Department of the Attorney General to develop and undertake a public education program regarding the prohibition.

HB832 RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY LEASES.

CPC, JHA

Prohibits the resetting of lease rents for long-term commercial leases above a level that is economic for the lessee's actual use of the property. Requires that a lessee whose long-term commercial lease has been terminated be compensated for the value of buildings, infrastructure, and businesses created by the lessee that will be retained by the lessor. Allows a lessee the right to purchase the property at fair market value.

HB833 RELATING TO COMMUNITY LAND TRUSTS.

HSG, FIN

Authorizes the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to establish a five-year community land trust equity pilot program to provide community land trusts with a line of credit to fund the acquisition, rehabilitation, renovation, or construction of housing for certain households and report to the Legislature regarding the pilot program. Appropriates moneys from the Dwelling Unit Revolving Fund for establishment of the pilot program.

HB834 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, CPC, JHA

Categorizes electric bicycles into three classes based on speed and operation. Requires electric bicycle manufacturers and distributors to apply a label to each electric bicycle. Imposes a requirement that counties inform individuals of the applicable traffic code, safety information, and penalties for violations at the time of registering a bicycle.

HB835 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC, JHA

Imposes a less deferential standard of negligence on officers and directors of condominium associations incorporated under HRS 414D. Ensures that officers and directors of condominium associations are held accountable by imposing a reasonable person standard of negligence.

HB836 RELATING TO PENALTIES.

JHA

Mandates courts to impose an enhanced sentence for theft and burglary offenses over a certain property value threshold. Increases penalties for habitual property crime perpetrators. Targets fencing operations and imposes enhanced sentencing to those who knowingly receive stolen property or resell such property.

HB837 RELATING TO HOMEOWNER ASSOCIATIONS.

CPC, JHA, FIN

Establishes an ombudsman's office for homeowner associations within the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Establishes an ombudsman's office special fund. Requires board members of condominium associations, cooperative housing corporations, and planned community associations to meet certain educational requirements through classes offered by the ombudsman. Updates statutes relating to condominium associations, cooperative housing corporations, and planned community associations to integrate the role and functions of the ombudsman's office for homeowner associations. Appropriates funds for establishment of the ombudsman's office. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

HB838 RELATING TO TEACHERS.

EDN, FIN

Increases the bonus for teachers who achieve and maintain a current national board certification from \$5,000 to \$10,000. Appropriates funds.

HB839 RELATING TO THE PSYCHOLOGY

HLT, CPC, FIN

INTERJURISDICTIONAL COMPACT.

Adopts the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact to allow a person authorized to practice psychology in a compact state in which the person is not licensed.

HB840 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII

HED, FIN

ATHLETICS.

Appropriates moneys to athletics departments of the University of Hawaii.

HB841 RELATING TO RETIRED TEACHERS.

EDN, LAB, FIN

Requires retirants rehired as teachers or administrators in teacher shortage areas or in difficult-to-fill positions to be paid at least the minimum salary for their experience and qualifications. Prohibits rehired retirants from receiving additional employment benefits. Directs the Department of Education to adopt rules to identify teacher shortage areas and difficult-to-fill positions.

HB842 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH AT THE UNIVERSITY

HED, FIN

OF HAWAII.

Appropriates funds to the University of Hawaii at Manoa to establish three additional permanent mental health practitioner positions within the Division of Student Success' Counseling and Student Development Center

Student Development Center.

HB843 RELATING TO THE COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESILIENCE.

HED, FIN

Appropriates funds for critical repairs, maintenance, demolition, design, and construction for facilities of the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resilience at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. Establishes and appropriates funds for positions within the University of Hawaii for the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resilience.

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. **HB844**

TRN, CPC, JHA

Amend the State's regulation of sun screening devices on motor vehicles by lowering the allowable amount of light transmittance for vehicle windows from 35%, plus or minus 6%, to 25%, plus or minus 5%.

HB845 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS. AGR, JHA, FIN

Prohibits certain foreign parties from owning, purchasing, or acquiring an interest in agricultural lands. Establishes an Office of Agricultural Intelligence within the Department of Agriculture to investigate claims that land is unlawfully owned by a prohibited foreign party. Requires the Attorney General to undertake enforcement activities. Appropriates moneys.

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS. HB846

CPC

Raises the threshold exemption under the contractor licensing law's handyman exemption from \$1,500 to \$2,500.

RELATING TO HAWAII RETIREMENT SAVINGS ACT. HB847

LAB, FIN

LAB, FIN

Clarifies the definition of "covered employer" under the Hawaii Retirement Savings Act. Requires covered employers to automatically enroll covered employees into the Hawaii Retirement Savings Program unless the employee chooses to opt out. Repeals the limit on the total fees and expenses that can be spent for the Program each year. Appropriates funds to the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for the

development and operation of the Program.

RELATING TO EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS

TRUST FUND CONTRIBUTIONS.

Sets the amount of the employer contribution to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund as a fixed percentage of the health benefits plan or life insurance plan premium cost.

Makes conforming amendments.

HB848

<u>HB849</u> RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC, JHA

Clarifies that the terms of a loan must first be sent to unit owners and approved by a majority of unit owners' consent to the loan. Requires a majority of unit owners to vote in favor of or provide written consent to maintenance fee increases before they take effect. Requires a forensic audit of an association's financial records no less frequently than once every three years, with the first forensic audit to be completed by 6/30/2026.

HB850 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC

Clarifies an association board's authority with respect to calling electronic meetings, electronic voting, and mail voting. Clarifies that, in condominium elections, cumulative voting rights apply to all candidates regardless of whether they are nominated. Clarifies that individual votes are used in cumulative voting.

HB851 RELATING TO SELF DEFENSE.

JHA

Clarifies that a person who uses deadly force in self-defense does not have a duty to retreat if they are in their dwelling or on their property unless they are the initial aggressor. Repeals statutory language that permits a person to use deadly force at their place of work.

<u>HB852</u> RELATING TO SERVICE CHARGES.

CPC

Prohibits restaurants from imposing a mandatory gratuity service charge for the sale of food or beverage services unless the party includes ten or more customers, the service charge does not exceed eighteen per cent, and the customer is notified of the service charge.

HB853 RELATING TO TAXATION.

HSH, ECD, FIN

Establishes a refundable Family Caregiver Tax Credit for nonpaid family caregivers. Requires the department of taxation to report to the legislature before the convening of each regular session.

HB854 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES OF

PBS, FIN

COMMITTED PERSONS.

Appropriates \$500,000, for each year of the fiscal biennium to the department of corrections and rehabilitation to procure a new software for electronic record keeping of medical records. Requires a report to the legislature.

HB855 RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. HSG, JHA, FIN

Provides that a living beneficiary's place on the Department of Hawaiian Home Land's waitlist for any residential, agricultural or pastoral tract may be designated for transfer to a successor if the living beneficiary dies before receiving an offer for a tract; provided that the successor shall be at least twenty-five per cent native Hawaiian.

HB856 RELATING TO THE COLLEGE OF TROPICAL HED, FIN

AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES.

Appropriates funds for eight full-time agricultural technician, and four full-time coordinator positions at University of Hawaii at Manoa College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources.

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. HB857

HLT, CPC

Requires all accident and health or sickness insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations operating in the State to adopt policies, procedures, and criteria for approving or denying requests for prior authorization that are the equivalent to the guidelines for prior authorization established by Medicare.

HB858 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS. AGR, FIN

Establishes the agricultural statistics program in statute.

Appropriates funds for the program.

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. **HB859**

AGR, JHA, FIN

Establishes an agricultural crime prevention program within the Department of Agriculture to provide grants, education, administrative enforcement, and other services for the benefit of the State's agricultural industry. Clarifies, creates, and strengthens laws regarding crimes and violations related to agriculture or agricultural lands and hunting on private agricultural lands. Establishes clear distinctions between administrative and criminal penalties. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO LIABILITY. HB860

TRN, JHA

Specifies that the State or a county that repairs or maintains a street of which the ownership or jurisdiction is in dispute between the State and county, shall be immune from liability for personal injuries or property damage arising out of the repair or maintenance of that street. Deems that maintenance of a street shall not confer ownership or jurisdiction over such street if the ownership or jurisdiction over the street is in dispute between the State and the county.

<u>HB861</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Designates student transportation as critical infrastructure and a critical service for Hawaii's public education system. Requires all school bus contracts between the State and the contractor to include certain standards, performance metrics, and accountability requirements to prevent service disruptions.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB862</u>	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION SERVICES. Authorizes the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans for school bus services if certain conditions are met.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB863</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Appropriates funds to the Department of Education for teacher-requested classroom supplies.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB864</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Allows newly graduated high school students to be eligible for workers' compensation coverage during the summer following their high school graduation while participating in Department of Education-sponsored work-based learning programs.	LAB, EDN, FIN
<u>HB865</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, requires the Department of Education to include the teaching of financial literacy in kindergarten through grade twelve. Requires students in grades nine through twelve to complete a one-half credit in financial literacy before graduation. Requires the Board of Education to provide professional development to teachers who are teaching financial literacy courses.	EDN, FIN
<u>HB866</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Directs the Department of Health to purchase and store a 1 year supply of mifepristone by working with 1 or more pharmacies in the State. Appropriates moneys.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB867</u>	RELATING TO RECREATIONAL FACILITIES. Requires all playgrounds located in state parks and on public school grounds to include special needs recreational playground equipment as part of the recreational apparatuses by 6/30/2027, including at a minimum a wheelchair accessible swing set. Establishes the Special Needs Recreational Playground	WAL, EDN, FIN

Equipment Special Fund. Appropriates funds.

Committee REFERRAL HB868 RELATING TO DISABILITIES. WAL, FIN Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to evaluate its facilities for compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and compile a list of non-compliant facilities. Requires report to the Legislature. RELATING TO ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION. **HB869** HED, FIN Expands eligibility for scholarships under the Hawaii Community College Promise Program to all qualified students. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO MEDICAID. HB870 HSH, FIN Directs the Department of Human Services to adopt rules to expand Medicaid eligibility to all children in the State from birth to age 5 years without regard to household income. Appropriates moneys. RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION JHA. FIN HB871 ACT. Clarifies that Act 130, SLH 2024, which amended the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, takes effect on either the date of the Secretary of the Interior's notification letter that Act 130 does not require congressional approval, or on the date that the United States Congress approval becomes law. HLT, CPC HB872 RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes health care practitioners to make undesignated prescriptions of epinephrine for the purpose of stocking a supply at various types of businesses and state and county government offices, including public schools. RELATING TO PESTICIDE BUFFER ZONES. **HB873** AGR, CPC Increases the buffer zone for restricted use pesticides around schools to one-half mile. Allows the use of restricted use pesticides within the buffer zone as part of invasive species control conducted by the Department of Agriculture or invasive species committees organized under the University of Hawaii Pacific Cooperative Studies Unit. **HB874** RELATING TO CHILD PERFORMERS. HSH, LAB, CPC Requires a parent or legal guardian of a minor in theatrical employment to establish a trust account for the minor. Requires

the employer of a minor in theatrical employment to deposit a portion of the minor's earnings into the trust account until the child becomes an adult. Clarifies that theatrical employment, as used in the State's child labor law, includes gainful occupation as

a social media influencer.

HB875 RELATING TO TOURISM. LMG, FIN

Appropriates funds for a State Capitol tour guide position within

the Public Access Room.

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE PRECEPTORS. HB876

HLT, ECD, FIN

Adds psychology, physician assistant, marriage and family therapist, mental health counselor, clinical social worker, rehabilitation counselor, and school counselor students to the definition of "eligible student" under the qualifications for the healthcare preceptor tax credit. Amends the definition of "preceptor" by adding psychologists, physician assistants, marriage and family therapists, mental health counselors, clinical social workers, rehabilitation counselors, and school counselors to the list of preceptors eligible to receive the tax credit. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2025.

HB877 RELATING TO ENCAMPMENTS.

HSH, EDN, JHA

Prohibits the erection, placement, construction, or maintenance of an encampment within one hundred feet from the property line of a K-12 public or private school or school facility.

RELATING TO LANDFILLS. **HB878**

WAL, JHA

Extends the landfill buffer zone from one-half mile to one mile. Requires the landfill buffer zone to apply to lands in the state conservation district and lands designated as national conservation areas.

RELATING TO CESSPOOL CONVERSIONS. **HB879**

EEP, WAL, FIN

Increases the maximum grant amount for the Cesspool Compliance Pilot Grant Project from \$20,000 to \$30,000. Establishes positions within the Department of Health for the Cesspool Compliance Pilot Grant Project. Appropriates funds.

RELATING TO EARLY CHILD INTERVENTION. **HB880**

HSH, LAB, FIN

Requires the Department of Human Resources Development to reclassify certain early intervention specialist positions within the Early Childhood Services Unit in the Department of Health. Appropriates funds for the reclassification of certain positions and establishment of new positions within the early childhood services unit.

HB881 RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES. EEP/PBS,

CPC/JHA, FIN

Establishes and implements the Catastrophic Wildfire Securitization Act, to allow public utilities to securitize rates in order to raise capital that can be used to pay for costs and

expenses arising out of catastrophic wildfires.

HB882 RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDITS.

ECD, FIN

Amends the amount of total income tax credits available. Increases the annual per production and aggregate caps. Provides the State with alternative marketing opportunities in lieu of a shared-card, end-title screen credit.

HB883 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

PBS, LAB, FIN

Requires the Hawaii emergency management agency to inventory all designated emergency shelters and their ability to withstand a category one hurricane or higher. Requires Hawaii emergency management agency to publish a publicly available list of shelters and their respective hurricane ratings. Appropriates funds for a hurricane shelter retrofit program and director.

HB884 RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

AGR, JHA, FIN

Prohibits certain foreign parties or their agents, trustees, and fiduciaries from owning, purchasing, or acquiring an interest in agricultural lands. Establishes an Office of Agricultural Intelligence within the Department of Agriculture to investigate claims that land is unlawfully owned by a prohibited foreign party. Requires the Attorney General to undertake enforcement activities. Appropriates moneys.

HB885 RELATING TO INSURANCE.

CPC, FIN

Establishes a program that requires property insurers to offer discounts to condominium associations that make certain upgrades or take other specific actions to increase the building's resilience or reduce the association's risk profile. Requires the insurance commissioner to adopt rules to implement the program.

HB886 RELATING TO TRAFFIC.

TRN, JHA

Provides that if a law enforcement officer lawfully stops a motor vehicle and the operator is cited for driving without a valid license, the officer shall not permit the operator to resume the use of the motor vehicle. Requires the motor vehicle to be moved by a licensed driver or towed at the owner's expense. Provides that the cited operator is responsible for arranging the operator's transportation from the scene of the stop.

HB887 RELATING TO PREVAILING WAGES.

HSH/LAB, JHA,

Requires prevailing wages for human services providers.

Committee REFERRAL **HB888** RELATING TO CARE CENTERS. HSH, LAB, FIN Requires that new and newly renovated state buildings with a budget of \$5,000,000 or more include dedicated space for a child care center or an adult day care center. HB889 RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS TOU, ECD, FIN TAX. Provides Hawaii taxpayers with a refundable transient accommodations tax credit. HB890 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS. CPC, JHA, FIN Establishes the Ombudsman's Office for Condominium Associations within the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Updates the Condominium Property Act to integrate the role and functions of the ombudsman's office for condominium associations. Appropriates funds for establishment of the Ombudsman's Office for Condominium Associations. RELATING TO MARIJUANA. HB891 JHA, FIN Decriminalizes the possession of drug paraphernalia relating to marijuana; possession of a certain amount of marijuana concentrate; and the possession of a certain amount of marijuana and smoking of marijuana in a public place. Lowers the criminal penalty for the possession of a certain amount of marijuana concentrate from a misdemeanor to a petty misdemeanor. **HB892** RELATING TO GEOGRAPHICAL RESTRICTIONS. JHA Establishes limitations on geographical restrictions provided as a condition of probation. RELATING TO FIREARMS. JHA HB893 Establishes prohibitions on assault rifles, assault shotguns, and .50 caliber rifles. Expands the ban on high-capacity detachable magazines. Establishes exceptions.

HB894 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

JHA. FIN

Prohibits state contractors, prospective state contractors, holders of procurement prequalification certificates, or principals of these groups from making contributions to, or soliciting contributions from their employees or from subcontractors or principals of subcontractors on behalf of, certain candidate committees, noncandidate committees, and political party committees. Requires the Procurement Policy Board to adopt rules to issue prequalification certificates to prospective contractors for public buildings or other public works. Amends the contribution limits for certain individuals and noncandidate committees. Prohibits lobbyists and certain persons related to lobbyists from soliciting contributions from client lobbyists. Increases the administrative fines.

RELATING TO THE ENFORCEMENT OF FIREWORKS HB895

LAWS.

Appropriates moneys to the county police departments to enforce applicable fireworks laws, subject to certain conditions.

HB896 RELATING TO SEXUAL OFFENSES.

Provides for a sentence of death or life imprisonment without possibility of parole upon a conviction for sex trafficking. Requires a separate sentencing proceeding by a jury, except if waived by the defendant, for a conviction for sex trafficking. Makes commercial sexual exploitation a class A felony. Makes conforming amendments.

Reduces the general excise tax rate on the gross proceeds or income from the sale of groceries that are eligible under the supplemental nutrition assistance program (SNAP) or special supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children (WIC), regardless of the means of purchase and the program eligibility of the purchaser. Reduces the general excise tax rate on the gross proceeds or income from the sale of nonprescription drugs. Requires DBEDT to conduct an economic cost-benefit

analysis on the GET reductions.

HB934 RELATING TO THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL ECD, FIN

EQUITY OFFICE.

Transfers the Hawaii Broadband and Digital Equity Office from the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to the Office of Enterprise Technology Services in the Department of Accounting and General Services. Establishes the

Hawaii Broadband and Digital Equity Special Fund.

Appropriates funds.

HB935 RELATING TO DIGITAL EQUITY. ECD, FIN

Establishes and appropriates funds for a digital navigator pilot program to offer technical assistance with computers and electronic devices to residents.

HB936 RELATING TO FINANCIAL LITERACY. EDN, FIN

Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, requires the Department of Education to develop and implement a statewide financial literacy curricula plan for public high schools. Requires all public high schools to offer instruction in financial literacy as a requirement for graduation. Requires the Department of Education to provide professional development to teachers on financial literacy. Requires the Board of Education to adopt administrative rules to implement the financial literacy education curriculum.

HB937 RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX. ECD, FIN

Establishes that any grants received from the federal Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) by an eligible business pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 shall not be subject to state general excise tax. Requires any state general excise tax paid by eligible businesses for RRF grants to be refunded to the tax payer. Applicable to taxable years beginning after 3/11/2021.

HB938 RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE INDUSTRY TRN, CPC, JHA

LICENSING ACT.

Authorizes manufacturers and distributors to sell directly to consumers items activated or installed through remote electronic transmission. Clarifies the applicability of the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Act to common entities. Amends the grounds for denying, suspending, revoking, or otherwise taking adverse action on a licensee. Prohibits a manufacturer or distributor from requiring a dealer to purchase or lease any electric vehicle charging station at the dealer's expenses unless provided notice of intent to sell the manufacturer's or distributor's electric vehicles. Clarifies the conditions for the transfer of a franchise. Clarifies the requirements for reimbursing a dealer for parts and labor.

HB939 RELATING TO ALCOHOL. CPC, FIN

Defines "low alcohol by volume spirits beverage". Establishes a tax on low alcohol by volume spirits beverages at a rate of \$0.85 per wine gallon.

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO. HB940

HED, FIN

Appropriates funds for the rat lungworm lab at the University of

Hawaii at Hilo.

Committee REFERRAL HB941 RELATING TO PEDESTRIANS. TRN, JHA Authorizes pedestrians to cross roadways in a manner contrary to the statewide traffic code under certain circumstances. RELATING TO HEALTH. **HB942** HLT, FIN Appropriates funds to the Department of Health for health care services contracted with community-based organizations. HB943 RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. HSH, FIN Requires and appropriates funds for the Department of Health to establish a homeless triage and treatment center program to serve homeless individuals and individuals at risk of homelessness with substance abuse issues or mental illness. RELATING TO NEIGHBORHOOD BOARDS. HB944 WAL, JHA, FIN Authorizes neighborhood boards to solicit suggestions for capital improvement projects and operating budget priorities from residents. Requires each county mayor to consider and respond in writing to the suggestions for capital improvement projects and operating budget priorities submitted by each neighborhood board. Requires each county council to consider the neighborhood boards' recommendations, the mayor's responses, and county fiscal health in determining the final budget. HB945 RELATING TO HOTELS. TOU, JHA, CPC Requires a hotel to provide notification of a service disruption, or that a service disruption may occur, to all third-party vendors and prospective and current guests. Prohibits a hotel from imposing any fee, penalty, or other charge, or retaining any deposit: if before check-in, a guest cancels a reservation due to a service disruption, unless the hotel provided prior notice; or if the service disruption arises after check-in, regardless of whether the hotel provided prior notification. RELATING TO CARBON DISPLACEMENT. HB946 EEP, ECD, FIN Establishes a carbon displacement tax credit for taxpayers of locally produced goods. Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to certify tax credit amounts. HB947 RELATING TO TAXATION OF REAL ESTATE ECD, CPC, FIN INVESTMENT TRUSTS.

Disallows the dividends paid deduction for real estate investment trusts. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2025.

HB948 RELATING TO HARBORS. TRN, CPC, FIN

Requires the Department of Transportation to construct, maintain, and operate customs and security facilities at

commercial harbors.

HB949 RELATING TO THE LOW-INCOME HOUSING TAX HSG, ECD, FIN

CREDIT.

Clarifies that a partner or member that is a partnership or limited liability company that has been allocated a low-income housing tax credit may either further allocate the credit or transfer, sell, or assign all or a portion of the credit to any taxpayer. Extends the sunset date of Act 129, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, relating to the low-income housing tax credit, from 12/31/2027 to

12/31/2032.

HB950 RELATING TO BI-LEVEL LIGHTING SYSTEMS. EEP, FIN

Requires all newly constructed state buildings and facilities to use only bi-level lighting systems beginning 1/1/2026.

HB951 RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. HLT, CPC

Allows a patient seen in-person by another health care provider in the same medical group as the prescribing physician to be prescribed an opiate prescription for a three-day supply or less

via telehealth.

RELATING TO PARKINSON'S DISEASE RESEARCH. **HB952**

HLT. FIN

Establishes the Parkinson's Disease Research Collection Database to be administered by the Department of Health, to house a collection of data on the incidence of Parkinson's disease in the State. Establishes the Parkinson's Disease Research Collection Database Advisory Committee. Requires the Department to create a Parkinson's disease research collection database webpage by 1/1/2026, and submit annual reports to the Legislature.

RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS. HB953

HLT, CPC, JHA

Prohibits persons from operating a medical cannabis dispensary or producing, manufacturing, or selling cannabis products without a license from the Department of Health. Prohibits individuals from providing certain services to individuals engaging in unlicensed cannabis operations. Requires the Department of Health to send a cease and desist notice to

violators. Establishes criminal penalties.

HB954 RELATING TO PRIOR AUTHORIZATION.

HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes a comprehensive regulatory framework for prior authorization process in the State, including disclosure and notice requirements for utilization review entities regarding their prior authorization requirements and restrictions; qualifications and criteria for prior authorization review and appeals personnel; prior authorization process for non-urgent and urgent health care services, including the time frame by which utilization review entities must render a decision; adverse determination and appeal processes; prohibition of prior authorization for emergency health care services and medication for opioid use disorder; payments to health care providers; length and duration of prior authorizations; and exemptions for certain health care providers. Requires health insurers to utilize NCPDP SCRIPT Standard electronic prior authorization transactions by 1/1/2026. Requires utilization review entities to submit annual reports to the Insurance Commissioner each year. Requires the Insurance Commissioner to submit annual reports to the Legislature. Requires the Insurance Commissioner to adopt rules by 1/1/2026.

HB955 RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

HLT, FIN

Exempts from the general excise tax amounts received by a nurse entrepreneur for health care-related goods and services purchased under Medicaid, Medicare, or TRICARE.

HB956 RELATING TO IRONWORKERS.

LAB, CPC, JHA

Prohibits any person from disassembling, dismantling, or demolishing iron projects unless the person has completed an apprenticeship program for ironworkers approved and registered with the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations. Establishes penalties. Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to adopt rules.

HB957 RELATING TO LAULAU DAY.

CAA. JHA

Designates May 1 of each year as "Laulau Day" in the State.

<u>HB958</u> RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, JHA, FIN

Requires all bicycles equipped with motors to be operated only with all wheels on the ground at all times, with certain exceptions. Prohibits certain actions while operating a bicycle equipped with a motor. Defines "electric bicycle" in place of "low-speed electric bicycle". Defines "electric micro mobility device" and requires the same regulations as electric foot scooters to apply to electric micro mobility devices. Authorizes a person to ride an electric bicycle on a sidewalk at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour. Prohibits a person from operating a bicycle or electric foot scooter under the age of eighteen without a helmet. Repeals the requirement that moped drivers use bicycle lanes. Substitutes the word "motor drive cycle" with the word "motor scooter". Appropriates funds for a coordinated education campaign on electric mobility devices.

HB959 RELATING TO TAXATION.

ECD, FIN

Exempts the sale of groceries and nonprescription drugs from the general excise tax. Incrementally increases the general excise tax over four years, with the increased proceeds during certain fiscal years to be deposited into the general fund. Removes the state income tax on unemployment compensation benefits. Doubles the standard deduction for individuals earning less than \$100,000 and joint returns earning less than \$200,000. Repeals the incremental increases on standard income tax deduction amounts. Increases the minimum income threshold and exemption amount for the low-income household renters' income tax credit. Removes the tax liability for the first \$100,000 of individual income earned. Establishes the Maui Recovery Special Fund to be used for recovery programs related to the 2023 Maui wildfires. Appropriates funds. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2024.

HB960 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, FIN

Increases the maximum value of capital advancement contracts that may be executed by the Department of Transportation without legislative approval. Repeals the requirement for the Department of Transportation to obtain legislative approval through concurrent resolution for capital advancement contracts greater than \$2,000,000. Increases the total aggregate value of capital advancement contracts that the Department of Transportation may enter into in a fiscal year. Establishes certain reporting requirements related to capital advancement contracts.

REFERRAL HB961 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Establishes and appropriates funds for a two-year librarian pilot program to serve one school complex on Oahu and one school complex on a neighbor island. **HB962** RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Requires the Department of Education to establish and administer a two-year school librarian pilot program to provide funding for qualifying schools to hire librarians. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO CRIMES AGAINST ELDERS. HB963 HSH, JHA Establishes strict liability for crimes against elders with respect to the attendant circumstance that the victim was sixty years of age or older. **HB964** RELATING TO TRESPASSING. WAL, JHA, FIN Prohibits loitering or camping near state-owned streambanks. Authorizes law enforcement or authorized personnel to remove individuals after notice. Appropriates funds to support enforcement, public education, and environmental restoration efforts. RELATING TO MICROPLASTICS. **HB965** EEP, FIN Establishes a microplastic filtration rebate program within the Department of Land and Natural Resources. RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL TOURISM. HB966 AGR/TOU, WAL, Establishes statewide, uniform standards to promote agricultural JHA tourism activities in the State by establishing state agricultural tourism activity requirements that are applicable to all counties that have adopted an agricultural tourism ordinance. Requires agricultural tourism activities to be registered by the county planning commission. Requires agricultural tourism activities to coexist with an agricultural activity on a farming operation and requires termination of the agricultural tourism activities upon cessation of the agricultural activity. Makes conforming amendments. **HB967** RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS. AGR, FIN Establishes the Statewide Interagency Food Systems Coordination Team and the Interagency Food Systems Working Group within the Department of Agriculture. Requires reports to the Legislature. Establishes positions. Appropriates funds.

HB968 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE. AGR, FIN

Requires the Department of Agriculture to establish a Healthy Soils Program. Requires an annual report to the Legislature.

Appropriates funds.

HB969 RELATING TO WASTE OR DISPOSAL FACILITIES. EEP, WAL, JHA

Prohibits the construction, modification, or expansion of any waste or disposal facility on land that is near or above a significant aquifer as determined by the Department of Health.

HB970 RELATING TO CHIROPRACTIC. HED, CPC

Allows chiropractic students to engage in clinical practice as part of their college instruction if directly supervised by a licensed

chiropractor.

RELATING TO STATE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS. HB971

LAB, HSG, FIN

Establishes the Office of the State Architect within the Department of Accounting and General Services to be headed by the State Architect. Authorizes the State Architect to organize, manage, and oversee the design review of all state construction projects and issue design approvals. Establishes the Design Review Special Fund. Requires the State Architect to submit a report to the Governor and Legislature. Authorizes DAGS to provide centralized design review services for state construction projects and issue design approvals through the State Architect. Exempts state construction projects from county building permit, inspection, and certificate of occupancy requirements, subject to

certain conditions. Makes appropriations.

HB972 RELATING TO IMPACT FEES. TOU, CPC

Authorizes condominium associations and planned community associations located in a zoning district that allows for transient vacation rentals to impose an impact fee on owners who use their

units as transient vacation rentals.

RELATING TO TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS. HB973

TOU, CPC, FIN

Requires transient accommodations brokers and any other persons or entities to offer, list, advertise, or display a transient accommodations rental rate that includes all resort fees required for the furnishing of transient accommodations. Requires transient accommodations brokers and any other persons or entities to include all applicable taxes and fees imposed by a government on the stay in the total price to be paid before the consumer reserves the furnishing of transient accommodations.

Establishes penalties. Effective 1/1/2026.

HB974 RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

Allows the State to enter into step-in agreements for payment obligations arising under certain power purchase agreements. Establishes the Power Purchasing Costs Trust Fund. Establishes that revenues from on-bill charges for power purchase agreements and accompanying reserves shall be held in trust by the State, and that independent power producers shall hold a beneficial interest in the revenue and reserve to the extent of the amounts owed under the covered power purchase agreements. Appoints, authorizes, and empowers an electric utility to serve as the billing, collection, payment, and managing agent of the Department of Budget and Finance in the service of performing step-in agreements.

HB975

RELATING TO CARBON SEQUESTRATION INCENTIVES. EEP, FIN Codifies and makes permanent the Hawaii Carbon Smart Land Management Assistance Program under the Department of Land

and Natural Resources.

HB976

RELATING TO RENEWABLE FUEL.

EEP, ECD, FIN

Establishes the sustainable aviation fuel import tax credit. Increases the renewable fuels production tax credit amount. Repeals the: (1) cap amount of claimable renewable fuels production tax credit; (2) requirement that the tax credit be claimed for fuels with lifecycle emissions below fossil fuels; and (3) prohibition on claiming other tax credits for the cost incurred to produce renewable fuels. Specifies that the renewable fuels production tax credit can only be claimed for fuels that meet the certain thresholds. Adds an additional tax credit value. Clarifies that a taxpayer who previously claimed a renewable fuels production tax credit may claim another one for taxable years beginning after 12/31/2024. Clarifies and expands required information in the certified statement for the tax credit. Provides that a fee shall not be charged to the borrower in connection with the maintenance or disbursement of insurance proceeds received by the financial institution. Provides that the minimum interest rate paid on insurance proceeds be based on the national rate for money market accounts, as determined according to title 12 C.F.R. section 337.7 and will be credited to the borrower monthly.

HB1048

RELATING TO INSTALLMENT LOANS.

CPC, FIN

Clarifies the intended scope of chapter 480J, HRS, which is the regulation of installment lenders, and that the law does not intend to eliminate the ability of lenders to make low-interest rate loans under existing interest and usury laws. Replaces the term "consumer loan" with the defined term "installment loan" for consistency throughout the statutes. Requires loan maintenance fees to be prorated daily to prevent consumers from incurring fees once the loan is paid off. Establish a pilot program in the Department of Health to provide intensive mobile treatment-type services, e.g., "street psychiatry," to chronically houseless people suffering from serious brain disorders like schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorder.

RELATING TO CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE. HB1132

WAL, PBS, JHA

Enhances sharing of critical infrastructure information between infrastructure owners and operators and the state government. Defines and protects "critical infrastructure information" that is crucial for direct support of the security and resilience of the State. Provides homeland security partners with reassurance that their proprietary information provided to the state government will be protected from disclosure.

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED HB1133

HLT, JHA

SUBSTANCE ACT.

Updates chapter 329, HRS, to make it consistent with amendments in the Federal Controlled Substances Act as required under section 329-11, HRS.

HB1134 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. LAB, FIN

Allows a retirant to be employed without reenrollment in the Employees' Retirement System and without loss or interruption of retirement benefits if the retirant is employed as an investigator in a position identified by the Department of the Attorney General or the Department of Law Enforcement as a labor shortage or difficult—to-fill position, subject to certain conditions. Requires the director of human resources of the appropriate state jurisdiction or the human resources management chief executive of each county to include in their

annual reports to the Legislature, details on the employment of

retirants as investigators.

HB1135 RELATING TO THE WAGE AND HOUR LAW.

LAB, JHA

Authorizes the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to issue an order of wage payment violation to the employer found to be in violation of wage and hour provisions. Establishes penalties, enforcement, and appeal procedures. Amends the definition of "wage" to include compensation for labor or services rendered by an employee, whether the amount is determined on a time, task, piece, commission, or other basis of calculation.

HB1136 RELATING TO HAWAII RETIREMENT SAVINGS ACT.

LAB, FIN

Clarifies the definition of "covered employer" under the Hawaii Retirement Savings Act. Requires covered employers to automatically enroll covered employees into the Hawaii Retirement Savings Program unless the covered employee chooses to opt out. Effective upon approval.

HB1137 RELATING TO RESTORATION OF BEACH LANDS.

WAL, JHA

Amends the definition of beach restoration to include activities undertaken to maintain and improve eroded beaches and degraded dune systems through the management of sand and native vegetation, placement of sand, and activities undertaken to remove abandoned and remnant materials that pose a risk to public and ecosystem health.

HB1138 RELATING TO OCEAN USER SAFETY.

WAL, JHA

Authorizes the Board of Land and Natural Resources to issue interim rules regarding commercial and recreational use of water sports equipment.

HB1139 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP FEES.

TOU, WAL, FIN

Establishes within the Department of Land and Natural Resources the environmental stewardship fee program to collect a fee from visitors through an environmental stewardship license and allocate the revenue to protect, restore, and manage natural and cultural resources through grants to nonprofit organizations. Establishes the environmental stewardship fee special fund. Establishes the Environmental Stewardship Commission to make recommendations to the Board of Land and Natural Resources regarding the use of revenues in the special fund. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to conduct rulemaking. Requires a report to the legislature, including an environmental stewardship fee strategic plan. Creates civil or administrative penalties to be imposed after July 1, 2030. Appropriates funds.

Committee REFERRAL HB1140 RELATING TO HOMELESS ENCAMPMENTS ON HSH, WAL, FIN DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES LANDS. Appropriates funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources to cover its work cleaning up after the removal of homeless encampments on state lands under the Department's control. HB1141 RELATING TO UPDATING PUBLIC LAND LEASES WAL, JHA ISSUED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 171, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES. Requires that lease extensions approved by the Board of Land and Natural Resources be drafted on forms that reflect contemporary leasing practices and policies of the Board, and which shall control over conflicting or inconsistent provisions in the lease being extended. HB1142 RELATING TO STATE WATER CODE PENALTIES. WAL, JHA, FIN Adds a minimum penalty and amends the maximum penalty per violation of the State Water Code, expands the types of potential violations of the State Water Code, and makes each day that a violation exists or continues to exist a separate offense. Requires the Commission on Water Resource Management to consider certain factors when imposing penalties. RELATING TO A STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION WAL, FIN HB1143 INCOME TAX CREDIT. Reenacts the Historic Preservation Income Tax Credit, establishes a cap of the tax credit at \$1,000,000, for taxable year 2025 to taxable year 2030, respectively, and repeals the tax credit on December 31, 2030. HB1144 RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT IN THE STATE HISTORIC WAL, LAB, FIN PRESERVATION PROGRAM. Amend sections 6E-3 and 76-16(b), HRS, to allow the Department of Land and Natural Resources to employ both civil service and non-civil service professional and technical staff in its State Historic Preservation Program. RELATING TO CONFORMITY TO THE INTERNAL HB1145 **FIN** REVENUE CODE. Conforms Hawaii income and estate and generation-skipping transfer tax laws to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as

amended as of December 31, 2024.

Committee REFERRAL HB1146 RELATING TO PASS-THROUGH ENTITY TAXATION. **FIN** For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2024, requires all qualified members claiming a credit for pass-through entity taxation to adjust their income to include the qualified member's share of taxes paid by an electing pass-through entity. RELATING TO THE EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT. **FIN** HB1147 Clarifies that nonresidents who claim the refundable earned income tax credit are required to adjust the amount claimed using the ratio of their Hawaii adjusted gross income to federal adjusted gross income. Eliminates the unlimited carryforward on nonrefundable earned income tax credits for tax year 2022. RELATING TO TAX APPEALS. HB1148 JHA Clarifies that a notice of appeal relating to an appeal of a county tax is not required to be served on the Director of Taxation. HB1149 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS. **FIN** Repeals the general excise tax exemption for amounts received by independent sugar cane farmers. Repeals the general excise tax exemption for amounts received by a contractor of the Patient-Centered Community Care program that is established by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs pursuant to title 38 United States Code section 8153. Effective 1/1/2026. RELATING TO TAX COLLECTIONS. JHA. FIN HB1150 Suspends the statute of limitations on collections during the period an assessment is pending on appeal before the taxation board of review or tax appeal court. RELATING TO INCOME TAX WITHHOLDING. HB1151 **FIN** For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2024, (1) repeals the maximum tax rate that may be considered in determining the amount of income tax that must be withheld and the requirement that a standard deduction allowance be treated as if it was denominated as a withholding exemption, and (2) for the purpose of income tax withholding, permits the Director of Taxation to prescribe a standard deduction allowance in an amount more or less than one whole exemption. HB1152 RELATING TO TAX ADMINISTRATION. LAB, FIN Permanently exempts the software developer supervisor in the Department of Taxation and the data privacy officer and tax business analysts in the Director's office of the Department from civil service.

Committee REFERRAL HB1153 RELATING TO FUNDING ADJUSTMENTS FOR STATE **FIN** PROGRAMS. Authorizes supplemental allotments and transfer of unrequired balances for capital improvement program projects and establishes a protocol fund for each state principal department. Effective upon approval. RELATING TO CENTRAL SERVICES ASSESSMENT. HB1154 TRN, FIN Amends the transfer of funds for central service expenses from the State Highway Fund, Airport Revenue Fund, and Harbor Special Fund by: (1) limiting the deduction to five per cent of all receipts and deposits in the fund, or \$5,000,000, whichever is less, and (2) creating a process to deduct additional amounts based on the Consumer Price Index. RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. HB1155 FIN Exempts from the Hawaii Public Procurement Code contracts by government bodies to procure certain construction projects. RELATING TO SPECIAL FACILITY REVENUE BONDS. TRN, FIN HB1156 Amends section 266-52, HRS, to increase the total principal amount of special facility revenue bonds that may be issued by the Department of Transportation for harbor improvements. HB1157 RELATING TO CAPITAL ADVANCEMENT CONTRACTS. TRN, FIN Amends section 266-19.5(d), HRS, for the purpose of increasing the cap for the contract value of any one capital advancement contract (CAC) and the cap for the total aggregate value of CACs in a fiscal year entered into by the Department of Transportation with private parties for harbor improvements. Adds reporting requirements for the department. **HB1158** RELATING TO FIREFIGHTING AT COMMERCIAL TRN, PBS, JHA HARBORS. Limits civil liability of individuals who render firefighting services at any of the State's commercial harbors or roadsteads, any commercial harbor or waterfront improvement belonging to or controlled by the State, or any vessel within a commercial harbor or roadstead to only damages resulting from an

individual's gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions.

HB1159 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL HARBORS.

TRN, PBS, JHA

Specifically requires masters or persons in charge of vessels to follow an order by a harbor master to evacuate a commercial harbor in emergencies. Establishes higher penalties for noncompliance. Amends section 266-19(a) to include fines collected for violations of this section as moneys to be paid into the Special Harbor Fund.

HB1160 RELATING TO PUPIL TRANSPORTATION SAFETY.

EDN, FIN

Amends sections 286-102 and 286-181, HRS, to allow exemptions to include use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans, which may not meet school bus regulations for school bus services, but which shall otherwise meet vehicle requirements and qualifications set forth in chapter 19-143, Hawaii Administrative Rules, to the extent required by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Education, when adult staff chaperone escorts of students are provided while students are being transported between designated locations off-campus and designated locations on-campus.

HB1161 RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN, CPC, FIN

Provides authority for a county to impose a mileage-based road usage charge. Provides for disposition of funds of county mileage-based road usage charge. Clarifies the disposition of funds of state mileage-based road usage charge. Repeals the maximum amount a driver will pay in a state mileage-based road usage charge on June 30, 2028. Establishes a default state mileage-based road usage charge rate when missing, incomplete, or incorrect odometer reading information that will prevent the state mileage-based road usage charge from being calculated. Establishes a state mileage-based road usage charge subaccount to allow for the disbursements or reimbursements back to vehicle owners.

HB1162 RELATING TO MOTORCYCLE INSTRUCTION PERMITS.

TRN, JHA

Starting on July 1, 2026, requires all applicants for a motorcycle instruction permit to successfully complete a basic motorcycle rider course approved by the Department of Transportation before becoming eligible for the permit.

HB1163 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVERS LICENSING.

TRN, FIN

Amends section 286-236, HRS, to meet current federal regulations to allow the State to issue a limited-term non-domiciled commercial learner's permit and non-domiciled commercial driver's license for applicants who are unable to provide proof of citizenship or lawful permanent residency.

HB1164 RELATING TO HIGHWAY REVENUE BONDS.

TRN, FIN

Restores the revenue bond authorization for the Department of Transportation to issue Highway Revenue Bonds for highway capital improvement projects authorized in Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2023, as amended by Act 230, SLH 2024. Effective upon approval.

HB1165 RELATING TO HIGHWAYS.

TRN, WAL, JHA

Authorizes the counties to sell or dispose of property bordering the ocean when the Department of Transportation requests the acquisition of the property for state highway purposes.

<u>HB1166</u> RELATING TO AUTOMATED SPEED ENFORCEMENT

TRN, FIN

SYSTEMS PROGRAM.

Appropriates funds out of the State Highway Fund for deposit into the Automated Speed Enforcement Systems Program Special Fund and apporitates funds out of the Automated Speed Enforcement Systems Program Special Fund for fiscal year 2025-2026.

<u>HB1167</u> MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE

TRN, FIN

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

Makes an emergency appropriation out of the State Highway Fund to provide funds for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the Department of Transportation to enforce the Motor Carrier Law.

HB1168 RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII REVENUE

HED, FIN

BONDS.

Authorizes the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii to issue revenue bonds for up to \$800,000,000 for the purpose of financing qualifying priority capital improvement projects.

HB1169 RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII CONFERENCE HED, FIN

CENTER REVOLVING FUND.

Establishes the University of Hawaii Conference Center Revolving Fund and accounts under the fund to facilitate the administration of the revolving fund for conference center programs among various campuses and operating units of the University of Hawaii system. Repeals the Conference Center Revolving Fund, University of Hawaii at Hilo, and the Community College Conference Center Revolving Fund. Transfers all appropriations and encumbrances of the Conference Center Revolving Fund, University of Hawaii at Hilo, and the

Community College Conference Center Revolving Fund to the University of Hawaii Conference Center Revolving Fund.

HB1170

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RESIDENT TUITION FEE.

HED, FIN

Requires the University of Hawaii to grant the resident tuition fee for enrollment at any University of Hawaii campus to individuals who have graduated from a Hawaii high school and are enrolling in an undergraduate degree program, under certain conditions.
