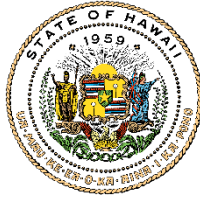

In consideration of
HOUSE BILL 201
RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL

House Bill 201 proposes to appropriate additional funds for the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations to support the salary of the State Fire Marshal. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources supports this measure.**

The Department strongly supports HB201 as the position of the State Fire Marshal is a crucial missing component of the state's fire service. A full-time State Fire Marshal's office will be able to provide critical input to and oversight of the State's fire code, standardize training requirements for county fire departments, provide fire investigations to determine fire origin and cause, as well as provide and coordinate public education and awareness on fire safety. The current salary appropriation from the 2024 legislative session only provides funds commensurate with the captain-level pay grade while requiring significantly higher responsibility and workload. Increasing the salary appropriation to be commensurate with that of fire chiefs within the state will increase the selection pool of qualified candidates.

Our mission is to amplify local voices and champion community-driven solutions, which are more critical than ever as we continue rebuilding and recovering.

Lahaina Strong, stands in **support of House Bill 201** and for the supplemental needs of the state fire marshal and a dedicated wildfire prevention team. The devastating August 8, 2023, Lahaina fire exposed Hawaii's urgent need for improved wildfire preparedness and response. Establishing and fully funding the State Fire Marshal's office is essential to ensuring proactive fire prevention and safety statewide. This role is critical, especially for vulnerable communities like Lahaina.
